The Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) is in the process of reviewing the above referenced. During review of the material submitted, the Division determined that the following issue(s) of concern shall be adequately addressed before the application can be considered for approval. Red text indicates new items.

## <u>Exhibit C</u>

1. Describe details of the fence to be installed. Material type, installation method, areas to be placed, total length, etc.

### <u>Exhibit D</u>

- 2. Will all installed fencing be removed upon completion of mining? If so describe reclamation measures regarding fencing.
- **3.** Though this site may receive little moisture, the potential for stormwater runoff, is of concern given the sites proximity to CO-141. Please describe the use and placement of BMP's (best management practices). Additionally how will the limited topsoil on site be protected from erosion.
- Question 3 Per Rule 6.3.4(1)(b) Provide a justification to support slopes steeper than a 3H: 1V.
  - a. Is the steeper slope stable, does it match surrounding topography, can sediment be retained until vegetation is established, etc.?

- 5. Per Rule 6.3.5(2)(a) It is unclear form your maps if the red rectangular polygon is the 1 acre permit boundary or if all of the smaller polygons make up the 1 acre permit boundary. Label accordingly on all maps.
  - a. State if the claim boundary is synonymous with the DRMS 1 ac boundary
- 6. Site Overview Map Per Rule 6.3.5(2)(b)



- a. List all the type of structure and owners of record of any permanent or man-made structures within two hundred (200) feet of the affected area. HWY 141 and the utility poles may be within 200 feet.
  - i. Verbally on the site inspection it was stated that the utility poles are beyond the 200 foot buffer however the Area Overview map has three poles within the buffer. Please clarify.
- 7. Reclamation Maps Per Rule 6.3.5(2) (b) Indicate where vegetation (seeding) will not be established AND 6.3.5(2) (d) and (e) By project area state the average depth of overburden and topsoil to be replaced.
  - **a.** Might be easier to include a text box on each reclamation map summarizing how much overburden and topsoil will be applied. And that all affected land will be seeded and the anticipated total acreage.

- 8. Per Rule 6.3.12, Address any permanent man-made structure within two hundred (200) feet affected lands. If none exist explicitly state that.
  - a. Please provide the Division with documentation that Structure Agreements were sent.
  - **b.** where such an agreement cannot be reached, the applicant shall provide an appropriate engineering evaluation that demonstrates that such structure shall not be damaged by activities occurring at the mining operation
