Re: Gleason Stock Pond, Reference No. M-2020-046, Division Response to "Is It Mining?" Questionnaire, No Permit Required.

Dear Mr. Monger,

Thank you for taking the time to discuss your project with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division). The Division received your completed "Need for a Reclamation Permit" questionnaire on September 30, 2020. Based on the information you submitted the purpose of the excavation project is to build a stock pond on private land owned by Roy and Barbara Gleason. It was disclosed that the excess material will be hauled off site and stockpiled in Grand Junction for future projects conducted by Parkerson Construction Inc. During a site inspection conducted by Division staff the operator stated that once the pond is completed the Colorado Division of Water Resources will inspect the finished pond and verify it is built to an approvable specification. Documentation of the approval of the stock pond from the Division of Water Resources must be submitted to the Division once received by either Mr. Gleason or Parkerson Construction Inc. to avoid the potential of enforcement action.

Based on the information contained in the correspondence it is the Division's opinion that no reclamation permit will be required from this agency at this time. However, other local, state, or federal permits may be required and it is recommended that you contact those agencies for further clarifications if you have questions. Please be advised that this opinion is being offered based on the information provided in your response. Any significant deviation from the described activity, including removal for sale or trade of any excavated materials from its natural state could result in a review and possible reversal of this opinion.

Please consider the following: if the Division receives different information or a written complaint regarding the proposed activities it is required by law to further investigate. If the investigation shows a possible violation of the Construction Materials Act and Rules an enforcement action would be initiated which could include civil penalties, a cease and desist order and obtaining a permit for the activities.

The Mined Land Reclamation Board (MLRB) has requested that the Division make determinations as to the need for a Mined Land Reclamation Permit. If you have any concerns or disagree with this decision, you may petition the Board during a formal public hearing for a formal Declaratory Order concerning this matter. The request must be made in writing and received no later than



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10 days prior to the next regular scheduled MLRB hearing. The next available MLRB hearing is November 18-19, 2020.
