OBSERVATIONS

The Tucson South Resource site was inspected by Patrick Lennberg with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS). The inspection was completed as part of an acreage release request, submitted in accordance with Rule 4.17, received by the Division on October 13, 2020. The site was previously inspected by the Division on January 24, 2019 as part of the Division's pre-operation inspection related to AM-01. Christine Felz, representing the operator Aggregate Industries (AI), accompanied me during the inspection. The weather was clear and warm.

The Tucson South Resource site is located in Adams County approximately 0.75 miles west of Brighton, Colorado. Currently, the site is permitted for 307.7 acres with a maximum allowed disturbance of 258.5 acres. Mining activities have not begun yet.

In AM-01 AI proposed to mine the site in three distinct phases. Phase 1 (South Area) was proposed to be wet mined and backfilled with overburden and non-marketable material. Phase 2 (West Area) and the Phase 3 (East Area) are to have a slurry wall installed around the propose mine cells. Once the slurry wall is installed, AI intends to dewater and dry mine the material within the cells. For more specific details, please see the approved Mining and Reclamation Plans included with AM-01. In May 2020 AI submitted TR-02 to remove the South Area from the Mining and Reclamation Plan and Maps. This Acreage Release request is to remove the South Area from the permit.

The Division sent notice of the release request to the Adams County Commissioners, Adams County Department of Planning and Development, the West Adams Conservation District and the landowner. The Division did not receive any comments from the noticed parties.

Al has requested release of the South Area, 24.3 acres, of the permit area. The South Area consists of an agricultural field. A small ditch borders the southwest side of the South Area, the ditch appears to be an unlined ditch and is used for return flow to the river from the Brighton Ditch. No mining or disturbance has occurred in the South Area.

Based on observations made during this inspection the release request of 24.3 acres will be approved. Notice of the Division's decision regarding the release request will be sent under a separate cover letter after a 30 day comment period ends.
