GENERAL INSPECTION TOPICS

This list identifies the environmental and permit parameters inspected and gives a categorical evaluation of each. No problems or possible violations were noted during the inspection. The mine operation was found to be in full compliance with Mineral Rules and Regulations of the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board for the Extraction of Construction Materials and/or for Hard Rock, Metal and Designated Mining Operations. OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted by Tim Cazier (DRMS) as part of a surety reduction request. The Permittee (Cheyenne County) was represented by Mr. Jim Brown during the inspection. The Rother Pit #2 is accessed from Co Rd 53 approximately 0.2 miles south of the intersection with Co Rd D, roughly 14 miles SE of Cheyenne Wells. This is a 110c sand and gravel mine. It was not operating at the time of the inspection.

The site was observed to not yet meet the following standards approved in the reclamation plan.

Backfilling and Grading:

Grading has not been completed. Although some grading has been completed on the SE corner of the pit (see **Photo 1**), most highwalls observed during the June inspection remain (see **Photo 2**). Post mine gradients will be no steeper than 3H:1V [*Reference: 2019 Reclamation Plan*]. Mr. Brown pointed out a material stockpile that will be used by the County (see **Photo 3**). This will need to be removed or used as backfill prior to spreading the topsoil.

Revegetation:

Vegetation has not been seeded or established in the affected area (see **Photo 1**). I advised Mr. Brown the DRMS prefers to see the result of the seeding effort after at least two growing seasons to be assured the perennial cover is being established prior to release. The Natural Resource Conservation Service recommended the following seed mixture which was approved by the DRMS:

Signs and Markers:

The permit sign was properly posted (see **Photo 4**) and should remain at the site entrance until the DRMS releases the site from reclamation responsibility.

<u>Topsoil:</u>

The topsoil stockpile on the north side of the pit (see **Photo 5**) has not been spread, and should not until final slope grading has been completed. A minimum of 12 inches of topsoil (plant growth medium) was proposed in the original Exhibit D, Reclamation Plan and approved by the DRMS for this site.

Summary:

The DRMS will deny the request for a surety release based on the observations summarized above.




Photo 1. Grading on SE corner and lack of established vegetation (looking SE).




Photo 3. Material stockpile and incomplete grading in pit area (looking ESE).
