RE: Western Slope Flagstone Quarry No. 2, File No. M-1996-076 Acreage Release (AR-1) Request, Adequacy Review - 2

Dear Mr. Fontanari:

On December 18, 2020 the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) received additional documentation regarding your Acreage Release (AR-1) Request electronically from Mr. Henderson. The three maps provided (attached) did not meet the minimum requirements of the Act and Rules. The following adequacy items shall be provided prior to the Division considering the request.

Mining Plan Map:

- 1. Rule 6.2.1(2)(d) the permit boundary line has not been updated, nor does it depict the entire permit area,
- 2. Rule 6.4.3(d) the Division does not have a mining plan map that shows the entire extent of the affected lands,
- 3. Rule 6.4.3(a) adjoining owners of record listed are incorrect, land is no longer owned by Powder Mountain Ranch or Powderhorn Properties Co.
- 4. Rule 6.4.3(b)/(g) list of structures/utilities has not been updated
- 5. The anticipated mining phases/dates are inaccurate/misleading. Map(s) should be updated to reflect current progress thus far,

The current map is extremely hard to read, given the amount of information conveyed in a single black and white map. The Operator may wish to use several maps to convey all of the required information of Rule 6.4.3,

Reclamation Plan Map:

- 6. Rule 6.2.1(2)(d) the permit boundary line has not been updated, nor does it depict the entire permit area,
- 7. Rule 6.4.6(a) topo lines are not representative of anticipated final land configuration. If the removed field will not be mined, adjacent areas would need to be sloped from the edge of the new permit boundary,
- 8. Water conveyance features are not depicted, meaning they would need to be removed prior to completion of final reclamation,



- 9. Dates for reclamation phases would need to occur after mining has concluded and are therefore inaccurate,
- 10. Adjacent landowners need not be included on reclamation maps and are inaccurately listed,

The current map is extremely hard to read, given the amount of information conveyed in a single black and white map. The Operator may wish to use several maps to convey all of the required information of Rule 6.4.6,

Water Map:

- 11. Does not comply with Rule 6.2.1(2)(a),(b),(c), and possibly (e) no scale provided.
- 12. Unclear if this is an Exhibit G Map 6.4.7 or just another map showing some of the features on site 6.4.3(f)

Please submit your response(s) to the above listed issue(s) by <u>Monday</u>, <u>January 04</u>, <u>2021</u> in order to allow the Division sufficient time for review. This revision has a decision date of January 19, 2021.

As you know, Fontanari has previously supplied the map and legal description showing the acreage reduction proposal.

You have requested modifications to the Mining Plan Map and Reclamation Plan Map. Mr. Fontanari has prepared drafts of the Maps, being the Modified Mining Plan Map, Modified Reclamation Plan Map, and Addendum A to Modified Reclamation Plan Map "Current and Revised Water Facilities".

(By way of note, the initial pit actually began its life as a stock pond, which is why the irrigation ditch was routed to it, and eventually engulfed by mining)
