Hi Amy:

I have completed the amendment to the Big Johnson Reservoir Permit M-2020-028 per your letter dated December 14, 2020 and items listed within this letter. Per your email below, I am emailing to you the amended permit for this project. The amended permit has addressed the following items:

1. Revised Exhibit "B" to reflect Big Johnson Reservoir to be included as part of the man-made structures and added the reservoir to the list of "reservoirs" that would receive drainage directly from the mine itself.

2. Revised Exhibit "C" to address the affected area within the permitted 30 ac. site; addressed the topsoil issue within and/or adjacent to the permit area; addressed the shoreline within and/or adjacent to the reservoir; addressed the clay material removed and/or stockpiled adjacent to the reservoir.

3. Revised Exhibit "D" to address the reclamation of the side slope areas within the reservoir including the proposed acreage involved with this reclamation; previously addressed the topsoil issue with no re-vegetation planned for the site.

4. Revised Exhibit "E" to address to addition of "Exhibit E - Mining Map"; location of existing fence within mining permit area; location of existing access roadway and temporary stockpile of clay material; location of side slope areas/reclamation areas at 6:1 side slopes; "Exhibit E - Reclamation Plan Map".

5. An amended copy of this permit was submitted today (1/21/21) to the El Paso County Clerk & Recorder's Office with the signed Proof of Filing document attached to this amended copy of the permit.

Please review this amended copy of the permit for Big Johnson Reservoir and let me know if you should have any additional comments pertaining to this submittal.

Upon application approval and permit issuance, this application becomes a legally binding document. Therefore, there are a number of important requirements which you, as a permittee, should fully understand. These requirements are listed below. **Please read and initial each requirement**, in the space provided, to acknowledge that you understand your obligations. If you do not understand these obligations then please contact this Office for a full explanation.

- 1. Your obligation to reclaim the site is not limited to the amount of the financial warranty. You assume legal liability for all reasonable expenses which the Board or the Office may incur to reclaim the affected lands associated with your mining operation in the event your permit is revoked and financial warranty is forfeited;
- 2. The Board may suspend or revoke this permit, or assess a civil penalty, upon a finding that the permittee violated the terms or conditions of this permit, the Act, the Mineral Rules and Regulations, or that information contained in the application or your permit misrepresent important material facts;
- 3. If your mining and reclamation operations affect areas beyond the boundaries of an approved permit boundary, substantial civil penalties may result to you as permittee;
- 4. Any modification to the approved mining and reclamation plan from those described in your approved application requires you to submit a new permit application and obtain approval from the Board or Office;
 - 5. It is your responsibility to notify the Office of any changes to your address or phone number;

6. Upon permit issuance and prior to beginning on-site mining activity, you must post a sign at the entrance of the mine site, which shall be clearly visible from the access road, with the following information (Rule 3.1.12):

- a. the name of the operator;
- b. a statement that a reclamation permit for the operation has been issued by the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board; and,
- c. the permit number.

7. The boundaries of the permit boundary area must be marked by monuments or other markers that are clearly visible and adequate to delineate such boundaries prior to site disturbance;

8. It is a provision of this permit that the operations will be conducted in accordance with the terms and conditions listed in your application, as well as with the provisions of the Act and the Rules and Regulations in effect at the time the permit is issued.

9. Annually, on the anniversary date of permit issuance, you must submit an annual fee (\$200), and an annual report which includes a map describing the acreage affected and the acreage reclaimed to date. You must also submit any monitoring required by the Reclamation Plan to be submitted annually on the anniversary date of the permit approval. Annual fees are for the previous year a permit is held. For example, a permit with the anniversary date of July 1, 2019, the annual fee is for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. Failure to submit your annual fee and report by the permit anniversary date may result in a civil penalty, revocation of your permit, and forfeiture of your financial warranty. It is your responsibility, as an operator, to continue to pay your annual fee to the Office until the Board releases you from your responsibility.

As an authorized representative of the applicant, I hereby certify that the operation described has met the minimum requirements of the following terms and conditions:

- 1. All necessary approvals from local government have been applied for (Section 34-32.5-111(1)(a)(IX));
- 2. This entire mining operation will not affect more than 30 acres;
- 3. This mining operation will not adversely affect the stability of any significant, valuable and permanent man-made structure(s) located within two hundred (200) feet of the affected lands. (However, where there is an agreement between the applicant/operator and the persons having an interest in the structure that damage to the structure is to be compensated for by the applicant/operator (Section 34-32.5-115(4)(e), C.R.S.), then mining may occur within 200 feet. Proof of an agreement must be submitted to the Office prior to the decision date.)
- 4. No mining operation will be located on lands where such operations are prohibited by law (Section 34-32.5-115(4)(f), C.R.S.);
- 5. As the applicant/operator, I do not have any mining/exploration operations in this state of Colorado currently in violation of the provisions of the Colorado Land Reclamation Act for the Extraction of Construction Materials (Section 34-32.5-120, C.R.S.) as determined through a Board finding.
- 6. I understand that statements in the application are being made under penalty of perjury and that false statements made herein are punishable as a Class 1 misdemeanor pursuant to Section 18-8-503, C.R.S..

This form has been approved by the Mined Land Reclamation Board pursuant to section 34-32.5-111, C.R.S., of the Colorado Land Reclamation Act for the Extraction of Construction Materials. Any alteration or modification of this form shall result in voiding any permit issued on the altered or modified form and subject the operator to cease and desist orders and civil penalties for operating without a permit pursuant to section 34-32.5-123, C.R.S.

No revision, extension, or renewal of the permit or of the time allowed to complete reclamation shall diminish the Operator's obligation under this Financial Warranty.

Upon completion of reclamation by the Operator, and if the Board finds the reclamation satisfactory, the Board shall release the Financial Warranty and cause the state treasury to issue a check payable to the Operator in the amount of the original Financial Warranty and to include all accrued interest.

In any single year during the life of the permit, the amount of the Financial Warranty shall not exceed the estimated cost of fully reclaiming all lands to be affected in said year, plus all lands affected in previous permit years and not yet fully reclaimed. Reclamation costs shall be computed with reference to current reclamation costs.

The amount of this Financial Warranty is based upon estimates as to the cost of reclamation, and does not operate to liquidate, limit, enlarge, or restrict the Operator's obligations to complete the reclamation, even though the actual costs thereof may substantially exceed the amount of this Financial Warranty.

This Financial Warranty shall be subject to forfeiture whenever the Board determines that any one or more of the following circumstances exist:

1. A Cease and Desist Order entered pursuant to Section 34-32-124 of the Act has been violated, and the corrective action proposed in such order has not been completed although ample time to have done so has elapsed; or

2. The Operator is in default under its Performance Warranty, and such default has not been cured although written notice and ample time to cure such default has been given; or

The Operator no longer has the financial ability to carry out its obligations in accordance with the

The Operator has failed to maintain its Financial Warranty in good standing as required by the

Act.

The description of lands herein is for convenience of reference only, and no error in such description, nor any revision of the permitted mining area, nor the disturbance by the Operator of lands outside of the permitted mining area shall alter or diminish the obligations of the Operator hereunder, which shall extend to the reclamation of all such lands disturbed.

If this Financial Warranty applies to National Forest System lands, and if this Financial Warranty is accepted by the United States Forest Service ("U.S.F.S.") as the bond required under 36 C.F.R. 228.13, then, the Operator having requested that the Board and the U.S.F.S. accept this single Financial Warranty in lieu of the separate bonds which would otherwise be required by applicable law, hereby agrees that, notwithstanding any other provision hereof, or of law, this Financial Warranty shall remain in full force and effect until U.S.F.S. has advised the Board by written notice that the Operator's obligations to U.S.F.S. for which this warranty is executed have been satisfied and until its release has been approved by the Board.

If this Financial Warranty applies to lands under the jurisdiction of the State Board of Land Commissioners ("Land Board"), and if this Financial Warranty, in whole or in part, is accepted by the Land Board as the bond required under its applicable law and procedures, then, the Operator having requested that the state accept this Financial Warranty in lieu of the separate bonds which would otherwise be required by the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board or Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety and by the Land Board, hereby agrees that, notwithstanding any other provision hereof, or of law, this Financial Warranty shall remain in full force and effect until the Board is notified in writing by the Land Board that the Operator's obligations to the Land Board, for which this warranty is executed, have been satisfied and until its release is approved by the Board.

If all or any part of the Affected Lands are under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Land Management, United States Department of the Interior, ("the BLM") and if at the request of the Operator on this Financial Warranty the BLM has, pursuant to 43 C.F.R. 3809.1-9, accepted this Financial Warranty in lieu of requiring a separate reclamation bond payable to the United States, then, notwithstanding any other provision of this Financial Warranty, or of law, the Operator hereby agrees that this Financial Warranty shall not be released until the Board is advised in writing by the BLM that the Operator's obligations to the BLM, for which this warranty is executed, have been satisfied and until its release is approved by the Board.

This Financial Warranty may be executed in multiple copies, each of which shall be treated as an original, but together they constitute only one agreement, the validity and interpretation of which shall be governed by the laws of the State of Colorado.

The provisions hereof shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their successors and assigns.
