OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted by Tim Cazier (DRMS) as part of a surety release request. Mr. Jerry Schnabel (representative for the exploration effort) was present during this inspection. The Hitch Rack Ranch is accessed from Hwy 115 about 15 miles southwest of Colorado Springs, in El Paso County. One to two inches of snow remained in shaded areas.

<u>Availability of Records</u>: Annual fees are paid through August 2020. The previous inspection was on June 13, 2017. No problems were cited. There are some discrepancies in the Permanent Final Abandonment Reports for the exploration holes. An adequacy letter for those issues was sent under separate cover.

<u>Backfilling and Grading</u>: Based on site observations during this and the previous inspections, no further backfill or grading is required. Borehole abandonment reports were received for all 13 holes have been received. Some clarifications have been requested as stated above. The approved reclamation plan for this NOI left final reclamation status of the drill roads up to the landowner. The release request submitted to the DRMS include a letter from the landowner stating the desire to keep the drill access roads for additional site access. Therefore, no road reclamation is required. No drill casings or cutting were observed.

<u>Financial Warranty</u>: As no further reclamation is necessary, the \$12,098.83 bond held by the DRMS is recommended to be released, once the discrepancies in the Permanent Final Abandonment Reports has been addressed.

<u>Fish and Wildlife</u>: No impact to wildlife was observed. Three deer were observed on the north ridge during the inspection.

Reclamation Success: Reclamation appears complete based on this and previous inspections.

<u>Revegetation</u>: The pad for hole B-2 is unique in that it is a little more than 200 feet off the primary drill road. Vegetation was observed through the snow on this road (see **Photo 1**). A small amount of common mullein (List C) was observed at the HC003-15 drill pad (see **Photo 2**), but not enough to be considered problematic. No List A or B noxious weeds were observed.

Storm Water MGT Plan: No oil or fuel spills were observed.

<u>SUMMARY</u>: The DRMS will recommend approval of the surety release request once the discrepancies in the Permanent Final Abandonment Reports has been addressed. We are required to wait 30 days after the decision to allow for an appeal. You will be notified under separate cover of our approval.
