OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety normal monitoring program. The Hall Pit is a 112c permitted site located off B ½ Road, approximately two miles south of Clifton, Colorado in Mesa County. Amy Yeldell of the Division conducted the inspection. Tyra Bartuska represented Oldcastle SW Group, Inc. dba United Companies of Mesa County and was present for the inspection

The permitted area is 50 acres, with a maximum disturbance of 9.4 acres. The Hall Pit is located adjacent to the BLM Pit No. 1 (M-2001-100) also permitted by Oldcastle. The mine identification sign and affected area boundary markers are in place and in compliance with Rule 3.1.12. The sign is located at the main pit entrance on the shared access gate. A scale and scale house remain in place along the access road. The pit was inactive at the time of the inspection and appears to be in an idol state. Commencement of final reclamation has not been declared.

A screen was located on site, but no other processing equipment was present. No fuel or other debris was located on site. All slopes have been graded to 3H: 1 V or less. According to the 2020 annual report 7 acres are currently affected and anticipated to be reclaimed in the next year. There are several stockpiles of processed material on site that will need to be removed. A small stockpile on the northeast corner of the affected lands appears to be "topsoil" though the material is poor in quality. Given the arid nature of this location noxious weeds need to be aggressively managed. The Operator may also wish to revise the seed mix and select or more arid adapted species, comparable to what is growing on the adjacent undisturbed areas.

The site appeared to be stable with no evidence of excessive erosion or ponding of water. Given the time of year no noxious weeds were observed actively growing.

The Division currently requires a financial warranty amount of \$22, 152 for this site. The bond was last recalculated with SI-1 in 2008. In an effort to ensure the Financial Warranty adequately, reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the approved reclamation plan the Division will be updating the reclamation cost estimate. If the current bond is found to be insufficient the Division will send a Notice of Surety Increase under a separate cover.
