### **COMMENTS**

A partial inspection was conducted by Rob Zuber of DRMS on March 25th. No Coors Energy Company (CEC) representative participated in the inspection. The site is in Permanent Cessation. Reclamation activities (including seeding) were completed in the fall of 2020.

The weather was cloudy and cool. Some snow patches were seen around the site, but the soil was not muddy because of the high quantity of sand in the soil at Keenesburg.

FISH and WILDLIFE – Rule 4.18:

One owl and other birds were seen around the ponds. No coyotes were seen but many tracks were seen around the site.

#### HYDROLOGIC BALANCE - Rule 4.05

Drainage Control 4.05.1, 4.05.2, 4.05.3; Siltation Structures 4.05.5, 4.05.6; Discharge Structures 4.05.7, 4.05.10; Diversions 4.05.4; Effluent Limits 4.05.2; Ground Water Monitoring 4.05.13; Surface Water Monitoring 4.05.13; Drainage – Acid and Toxic Materials 4.05.8; Impoundments 4.05.6, 4.05.9; Stream Buffer Zones 4.05.18:

Both Sediment Pond 2 and the Dugout Pond contained small amounts of water. Neither pond was discharging during the inspection. There were no signs that they had discharged recently. As usual, they both contained large amounts of riparian vegetation. No problems were observed with the two ponds.

#### GENERAL MINE PLAN COMPLIANCE:

The northern boundary of the site (including the ditch to Sediment Pond 2) was observed, and no signs of pollutant loading from the mine site, or any other problems, were seen.

#### RECLAMATION SUCCESS - Rule 4.15, Rule 3:

Most of the site was walked (all except southwest corner), and no erosion or other problems were seen. This includes:

- The areas that were reclaimed in 2019 and 2020, including roads, the Long Term Spoil Area, the B Pit area, and the footprints of old soil piles
- Area 25 west of the Dugout Pond
- Area 34 at the southeast part of the site
- The relatively steep slope between the Dugout Pond and the area where topsand was stored (south of facilities).

The southwest corner was viewed from afar (a location a few feet south of B Pit), and no problems were identified. The vegetation cover in Area 32 is very good and consistent with past months.

#### SUPPORT FACILITIES - Rule 4.04:

No problems were seen at the facilities area. The yard was being used by a third party. This was approved by Coors Energy, as noted in past inspections.

SIGNS AND MARKERS – Rule 4.02:

The entrance sign still lacks contact information for DRMS (including division name, address and telephone number). This must be remedied by the end of April 2021 for CEC to remain in compliance. An acceptable solution is to add another sign next to the existing one.

No problems were identified with boundary markers; they were seen on all sides of the site.
