Re: Keenesburg Mine (Permit No. C-1981-028), Review of 2020 ARR

Dear Mr. Moline:

I am reviewing the 2020 Annual Reclamation Report (ARR) for the Keenesburg Mine (submitted to the Division on March 5, 2021). As part of the review, I am checking that the ARR form for 2020 is consistent with the ARR Form for 2019. In particular, the acreage values in the left hand column in the new form (2020) should be identical to the values in the right hand column of the old form (2019). The version of the 2019 ARR form that should be considered is the most recent version: the one submitted to the Division on July 24, 2021. I see that the values do not match. Please revise the 2020 form so that the left hand column is correct, and then add acreage values to the middle columns, as appropriate.

The values in the middle columns could be the result of reclamation or other on-the-ground changes to site conditions. Alternatively, acreages in the middle columns could be based on a more accurate survey or based on an administrative change (e.g., a change in the classification of a particular parcel). Given the time that we spent on the 2019 form, I doubt that survey or administrative changes are needed, but please consider this possibility.
