OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Hay Camp Pit is located approximately two miles east of Dolores and accessed from Hay Camp Mesa Road. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 354.5 permitted acres. Because the pit is operated by a county the Division does not hold a financial warranty for this site.


Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.


This is an active pit with mining progressing to the west. Reclamation has occurred in much of the eastern part of the permit area. In the reclaimed areas, grading and vegetation blend well with the undisturbed surrounding area. Crushing equipment is located in the west part of the pit. Materials stockpiles are located throughout the pit area. Much of the slope on the south side of the pit, between the Hay Camp Pit and the Wallace Pit (M-1983-028), has been graded to 3H:1V or less. Topsoil is stockpiled along the crest of this slope.

Overall the site is well-kempt. No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
