On May 6, 2021, the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) received your Special 111 Operation Construction Materials Reclamation Permit Application package for the Burnham Property Borrow pit, File No. M-2021-031. Preliminary review of the information received determined the following items must be received before the Division can consider the application as being submitted and technical review can begin. Please respond to this Incompleteness Review with the requested additional/updated information on permit <u>replacement pages</u> and summarize each response in a cover letter titled "Incompleteness Review Response; M-2021-031".

The Division acknowledges this new permit application for the Burnham Property Borrow is to permit over the entirety of the existing Burnham Property Borrow, M2021-019, and include changes to the haul road alignment mandated by Weld County. It is the Division's understanding that when this new permit is issued the operator will request release of the old permit.

The application will not be considered filed until the information listed above is received and found sufficient to begin our review. A decision date will be established 15 days from the date of receipt of all of the requested information.

You have sixty (60) days from the above date to submit all necessary documents the Division needs for an application to be considered filed. If, at the end of the sixty day period, the application has not been determined to be filed with the Division, the Division shall deny the application and terminate the application file. The Division reserves the right to further supplement this document with additional adequacy issues and details as necessary
