Dear Mr. Hays,

Please accept this correspondence as response to the Notice of Objection dated May 11, 2021.

According to "Connection to Operation", the objector marked four connections. Mr. Carter searched public records and determined that Mr. Miller, et al. is not the land owner of proposed affected land, not a mineral owner in the proposed permit boundary, not the adjacent land owner and is not a nearby resident. Mr. Carter respectfully requests that Mr. Miller, et al. provide an accurate and documented "Connection to Operation."

The objection references a road that crosses the Stanley Mine claim that accesses property above the milling operation. Mr. Carter concurs that the road in question is "above the milling operation." The road to which Mr. Miller, et al. refer was included in your inspection on June 17, 2020. The road is unchanged, is not within the proposed permit boundary and will not be used for access to the proposed mill. The logs are removed that "barricaded" the access to the Stanley Mine claim.

During a phone call between Mr. Carter and Mr. Miller on May 11, 2021, Mr. Miller acknowledged that the Mine Zone District in Clear Creek County does not have property setbacks for site development. The proposed permit boundary was surveyed and Mr. Miller's photos clearly show that site development to date is within the proposed permit boundary. Trespass has not occurred.

Lastly, in June of 2020, Mr. Miller requested that Mr. Carter berm the property boundary in question. Mr. Carter constructed a berm as requested.
