OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Much of the site can be viewed from the entrance gate. Because the operator was not present, the inspection took place from outside the gate. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Monarch Quarry is located approximately thirteen miles west of Poncha Springs and accessed from Hwy 50. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 201 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$100,000 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is adequate.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The current affected area is contained within the permit area.

Mining consists of removal of material from the remaining limestone spoils piles left by CF&I. It did not appear that any quarrying had occurred since the Division's last inspection.

Settling ponds appeared in good working order. No problems regarding stormwater management were noted.

Fuel is stored in adequate secondary containment.

The site is orderly. No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
