OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Eli Perez, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Trout Creek Pit is located approximately 3.5 miles southeast of Buena Vista and accessed from CR 301. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 90 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$53,675.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is sufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Mining has been active in the upper bench area. Additional blasting has occurred since the Division's last inspection. A vertical highwall, approximately 20 feet high has been created on the east side of the blast area. The blast area daylights on all other sides. No signs of instability were noted.

A stipulation of the permit requires that the operator prepare industry standard blast reports for each blast in the quarry and submit copies to the Division with each annual report. The Division has not received the blast reports since September 2016. The operator shall, as soon as practicable, submit the reports to the Division.

Sorted materials stockpiles are stored at the base of the lower quarry.

Fuel is stored on site in tanks with adequate secondary containment.

Overall the site is orderly and well maintained.

Noxious weeds were not observed on site.

No other problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
