OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) normal monitoring program. The Blair Mesa Pit is a 112c permitted site that includes a total of 40 permitted acres. This site is located approximately 27 miles east of Rangely, Colorado in Mesa County and is accessed from Highway 6. The Division currently requires a financial warranty amount of \$114,211.12 for this site. Tyra Bartuska with Oldcastle SW Group, Inc. dba United Companies of Mesa County represented the operator and accompanied Amy Yeldell of the Division on the inspection.

The mine identification sign was present and the affected area boundary markers remain in place and in compliance with Rule 3.1.12. A wire fence delineates the permit.

The site is in final reclamation. The site was active at the time of the inspection and crews were observed completing civil work. Grading is nearly complete. What sloped have been contoured thus far are less than a 3H: 1V and blend well with surrounding topography. Some stockpiled have yet to be graded. Any excess material can be graded out flat to blend in. There is a stockpile of asphalt that will need to be removed from site.

All mining related infrastructure has been removed from site. Only the equipment currently being used for reclamation and a mobile fuel tank in secondary containment remain on site.

It is anticipated that seeding will occur this fall. Once revegetation takes place a minimum of two growing seasons is required prior to evaluating reclamation for success. While awaiting release weeds shall be managed to ensure that reclamation success is not inhibited.

No problems or violations were cited in this report.
