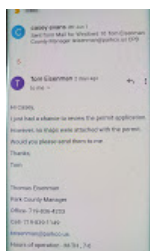

Revised Hard Rock NOI File # P-2021-011

1. Revised Hard Rock NOI form is as follows... The Material is very dense. Under review, I discussed with Russell Elliot that my calculations was wrong on yards of dirt out of each pit. New calculations depending on deposit 314 yards per pit max, 200 yards of paydirt will be hauled to wash plant. The rest will be stock piled next to each pit. Total yards of pay dirt will be - 10 pits x 314 yards each =3,140 yard of paydirt to be removed in 1 year to a 1 1/2 years time, my permit is for 2 years though the BLM.
2. The wash plant is a closed circuit processing system, all water is reused/recycled though the wash plant. The existing ditch is for storm water/rain water overflow if necessary. The ditch will be used to drain ponds at the end of the year allowing the water to infiltration and evaporate naturally
3. All water will be bought from Bailey Water Station, next to the police station. I fill up every day on my way to work, I have a 350 gallon water tank . We will not use any water other then water we bring on mine site.
4. Yes the water processing system is a closed circuit system / wash plant. The ponds will have pond liners that will be removed at the end of the year at reclamation. The fabric filter, located between the ponds will be removed at the same time, at the end of the year.
5. Revised seeding - 80 pound of mixed seeds per 10 pits - 8 pounds per pit max as necessary. 80 pounds of seeds per 1 acre of total disturbance. Sowing at least 2-3 pounds of seed for every 1,000 square feet. 20 -30 seeds per square foot. This is max. 80 Pounds of mixed seeds as follows -Moss Champion 5%- Drummond Sage 30%- Colorado Fescue 25%- Indian paintbrush 10%- Black root Sage 10%- Bog Sage 5%- Green rabbit brush 5%- Hooker sandwort 5%- Hairy goldenaster 5%. I will rake each pit and or any disturbed surface if needed when seeding is applied, watered, with the water I bring in from Bailey Colorado Water Station. Seeding will be topsoil only as per our discussion with my mining and safety specialist. Seeding will take place in August- October for good growth for the following year. We will keep all live soil alive , we will keep it upright and put back up right like sod/turf.
6. I will send over the Road Access paper work as soon as I get it for both Bar Star and JJWM LLP

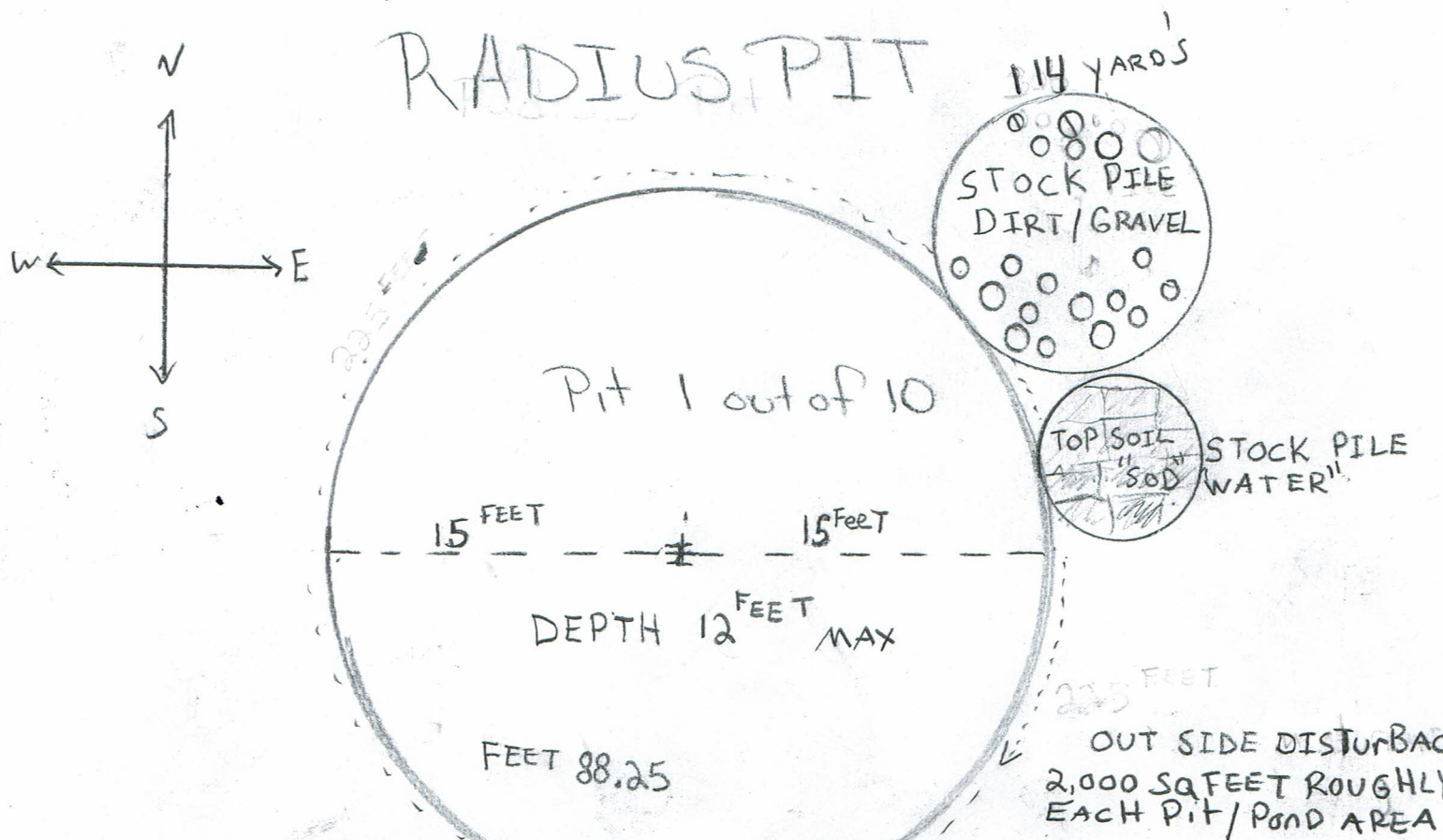

15' Radius, 225' outer Foot Disturbance

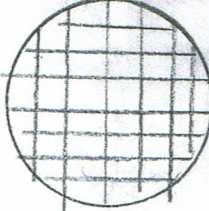
706 foot "Base Pit" by 3.14π
