CJK Milling Company LLC; 33084 Bergen Mountain Road, Evergreen, CO 80439, 303-563-2128, has filed an application for a Hard Rock/Metal Mining Limited Impact (110) Reclamation Permit with the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board under provisions of the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Act. The proposed mine is known as the Penn Mine, and is located at or near Section 20, Township 9S, Range 79W, 6th Prime Meridian.

The proposed date of commencement is September 1, 2021, and the proposed date of completion is December 31, 2025. The proposed future use of the land is forestry.
