This letter is provided in response to your correspondence dated and received on May 17, 2021 requesting consultation with our office for the above mentioned subject action pursuant to the Colorado State Register Act – Colorado Revised Statute (CRS) 24-80.1.

A review of our records shows that no previously identified cultural resources sit in the area of proposed action. Based on the documentation provided, we find that the subject action will not adversely affect properties listed on or nominated for the SRHP. Please note that our comments should not be interpreted as concurrence under the National Historic Preservation Act or any other environmental law or regulation. If human remains are discovered during ground disturbing activities, the requirements under CRS 24-80 part 13 apply and must be followed. Should the current subject action change, please contact our office for continued consultation under CRS 24-80.1.

In the event that there is federal agency involvement, please note that it is the responsibility of the federal agency to meet the requirements of Section 106 as set forth in 36 CFR Part 800 titled "Protection of Historic Properties". This includes not only reasonable and good faith identification efforts of any historic properties located within the area of potential effects, but determining whether the undertaking will have an effect upon such properties. The State Historic Preservation Office, Native American tribes, representatives of local governments, and applicants for federal permits are entitled to consultative roles in this process.

Speaking as the manager of Goltra Ranch West LLC, a Delaware limited liability company ("Goltra"), we would like to object to the Young Ranch resource quarry permit application. We own property in Gilpin County, CO adjacent to the proposed Young Ranch Quarry.

In 2017, we sold the property located east of the Central City Parkway to Young Ranch LLC, which is now proposed to be a valley fill or a waste dump for the Quarry.

The deed that we both signed which conveyed some or all of the property that Young Ranch desires to have be a waste dump (on Sections 27 and 28) contains a deed restriction which had clear intent to restrict mining on the Property as well as restricting ridgeline impacts on these lands (See attached enclosure). We believe that Young is attempting to circumvent the intention of this deed restriction through this application.

In addition to the dishonesty of intent, as land owners in the area, we don't believe that this particular spot can withstand mining without a lot of repercussions – ie. Slides, leeching into the water run off & stream. We haven't seen any intent or due diligence to show otherwise or safeguard the road & stream.





Comment/Objection Narrative *

As nearby property owners for the last 45 years, we have concerns with the proposed quarry project.

A super fund effort has been in progress along the Clear Creek watershed for several years to mitigate the negative effects mining has and continues to have on the water shed. It does not seem logical or timely to add to this issue.

Traffic on both the Central City Parkway and US 6 is our second concern. The CC Parkway was not necessarily designed with heavy truck traffic in mind. The impact on the road will be cause for unexpected maintenance. Central City is already struggling to meet their bond obligations. Can they really afford additional maintenance expense?

The truck traffic on US 6 already has negatively affected from the current Frei quarry. The amount of trucks has not only impacted the roadway itself but also the atmosphere and environment of a canyon that is being fostered as Open Space. Millions of dollars are being spent to develop a walkway/bikeway that will end up being a noise and polluted air experience.

Creation of additional ozone is also of concern. The quality of the air while crushing rock even with a water bath will add particulates to the air. Given the high elevation with less oxygen, a significant negative impact to air quality will result. This has been documented at the Fritz Peak Observatory.

We feel these factors make the proposal an unacceptable concept.

I am writing to express my concerns with the proposed quarry up the hill from my cannabis dispensary and lab facility. I have invested more than \$1.5 million into our new dispensary and over \$2 million in our lab. The two businesses employ nearly 20 local community residents. We plan to expand our operations in the future and bring more business and job opportunities to the area.

The dispensary and lab use water for sanitation and drinking purposes. Our future businesses and employees will also use our own water supply. The water used is not provided by the city of Idaho Springs, but instead is provided by an on-site well. I am very concerned that mining of the hill above my operation will impact my well and jeopardize my small businesses that depend on water.

Additionally, is there a way we can be guaranteed that no rocks or slides will roll down the hill into our buildings or put people in danger?

I am not personally familiar with mining processes, safety measures, or potential hazards, but this permit application popped on our radar recently and caused concern. We would like to learn more about geological testing that been completed and any hazard mitigation relevant for this permit if possible.

It has just come to our attention that there has been an application filed for a quarry 2 miles from Idaho Springs, Young Ranch Resource Quarry File No M-2021-009. We are absolutely opposed to this project for a number of reasons, some of which are outlined below.

We do not need two quarries so closely located in this region. The existing quarry on Floyd hill/I-70 is not just an eyesore but creates huge air quality issues from dust and truck traffic on Hwy 6. This project will just add to the air quality impacts.

Clear Creek and Gilpin counties seem to take the brunt of the most impactful projects, i.e. mining and the 4-lane highway to nowhere (Central City Parkway, and yes, I realize that it's a private road built by the city, but it's still a forever-scar on the landscape). We are becoming more and more of a tourist and recreation destination and adding to the eyesore will impact the ability to attract visitors. To say that the lands will be reclaimed is a stretch. The land will NEVER look the same or function the same. It is not a benign use of land but rather forever alters the landscape.

The trucks would most likely take the Central City Parkway to I-70 and then Exit onto Hwy 6. Here they will pass the Frei Quarry and add to the heavy truck traffic heading down and back to Golden. Clear Creek Canyon Park along Hwy 6 is now a major recreation destination and Clear Creek County is increasing work on their portion of the 65-mile Peaks to Plains Trail. The added truck traffic, noise and air pollution will impact the visitors to this world class trail system.

The other obvious impacts are to wildlife and water quality and quantity. Stating that the affected lands will be reclaimed to support a rangeland and wildlife habitat post-mining land use is an obfuscation.

This quarry project has snuck in under the radar and really needs to have a closer look by the EPA, as well as your agency.

We already have another quarry in close proximity that is causing a lot of erosion and disruption of wildlife. Not only that, it has bright lights shining out at night, onto adjacent roads and I-70. It's so bright that the light blinds drivers and it's only a matter of time before a fatality occurs thanks to the egregious light trespass the owners are committing. There's no doubt this next quarry will commit the same trespass, and this time next to a road that is used by vacationers and tourists coming to the gambling towns. It's not a very good way to welcome visitors -- "Here, drive this highway that has such bad light trespass coming from a quarry that you might drive off the road after you're blinded."

Perhaps the quarry operators of both should be forced to comply with safe lighting rules, instead of flouting them for private gain. I have been nearly blinded at night driving by the first quarry, there's no escaping the light trespass. It can be seen for miles and it unecessarily lights up the sky and the surrounding environment. There's nothing that says the owners of the new mine will do anything environmentally responsible like following lighting guidelines.

It's not clear that the EPA has been asked to do an environmental impact study for this quarry. It will use a lot of water, a substance that Denver and surrounding counties are looting from Gilpin County every day. Yet, WE in Gilpin are expected to just roll over and let a quarry use up even MORE water!

Quarries also disrupt wildlife and human habitation, just so an operator can make a few more bucks out of rocks. Are those rocks needed? Actually, it's not clear that this quarry is needed. Oh, sure, the family needs the money from it, but in the end, it will be taxpayers who foot the bill for the cleanup after its quarried out. A typical case of "privatize the profit, socialize the cleanup." And, when those rocks don't sell, who is stuck with the mess? You can guess.

Gilpin County has a mining history that is now resulting in Superfund cleanup sites. Those of us who live here don't need more of them. Moreover, we are now subjected to nearly 24/7 aircraft noise thanks to a Trump-era FAA ruling that pushes noisy aircraft over our pristine wilderness, all in the name of "saving jet fuel to save the environment". In reality, it's to save airlines money, but at what cost? Gilpin is being bombarded with noise constantly. Add to that Denver Water's incessant demands for more water by building a dam that will require hundreds of dump trucks to flow through our county each day, at still-unrevealed cost to our county -- and you can see why yet another quarry is not a good idea. Gilpin is tired of being the Front Range's throwaway county. This quarry will only add to the mess we have to put up with up here.

I do also wonder if the casino industry is behind something that will definitely affect access to their enterprises? As this quarry will do, sited as planned along a major thoroughfare that brings gambling dollars to the two towns.

All around, this quarry is a bad idea. It is dumping yet more inconvenience on a county already beleaguered by loss, by invasive noise, and pollution.

Please take a closer look at this proposal and vote it down. It's not in the best interests of our citizens.

I am writing on behalf of EMERGE, a citizens group located in Eastern Clear Creek County, which represents its membership on issues impacting "resources, growth and the environment" in the area of Clear Creek which is located to the east of Mt. Evans. We are submitting these comments in order to express our concerns and questions and to ensure that we can participate in future proceedings on this matter (Young Ranch Resource Quarry (File No. M-2021-009)). Please keep us informed on the status of this application."

It has recently come to the attention of EMERGE that there is an application into Clear Creek and Gilpin Counties for a proposed 335 acre rock quarry to be built northeast of Idaho Springs near the Central City Parkway. The Board of EMERGE has some serious questions and concerns about this proposal.

Transportation of the quarry product would lead to increased heavy truck traffic on Central City Parkway, I-70 and Hwy 6. If approved, the increased traffic added to the existing Frei quarry traffic would further congest and degrade these roads, particularly Hwy 6 which is a main route to Golden from Clear Creek and Gilpin Counties.

The economy of Clear Creek County relies heavily on tourism and recreation. Any proposed application that would negatively impact this section of our economy needs to be seriously examined. A new rock quarry would seriously degrade the air quality from dust and particulates and raise the noise level of the area. What will be the visual impact, especially from the highways and view corridors? Because Clear Creek County has significant tourist use, we wonder how would a new quarry with the accompanying dust, noise and degradation of the views impact tourists wanting to recreate in the area.

Water and the lack thereof is becoming a significant issue in Colorado and CCC because of climate change and increased drought. How much water would be required for this project for dust mitigation?

How will wildlife be impacted, especially with regard to sheep lambing?

Will the tax generated by the quarry offset the possible decrease in tourism dollars?

We sincerely hope that these concerns and questions will be taken into account when making a decision on the application.

Is this the best use of our limited water resources?

•The proximity to the the existing Frei Quarry increases my concerns about wildlife corridors and the volume of truck traffic that will be on the already overloaded state and federal highways. The trucks would most likely take the CC Parkway to I-70 and then exit onto Hwy 6 where they will pass the Frei Quarry and add to the heavy truck traffic heading down and back. Hwy 6 is the main artery east for Gilpin residents and for visitors coming to our two gaming cities as well as students going to Red Rocks Community College. The roads are always in a state of disrepair from the damage caused by the current mining trucks and will be made worse by adding more. Jeffco's Clear Creek Canyon Park is now a major recreation destination and Clear Creek County is increasing work on their portion of the 65-mile Peaks to Plains Trail. If the new trucks take the steep grade up to I-70, we will see more heavy trucks on an already crowded Interstate with steep grades down into Golden.

I am very concerned that this project is even being considered. That the applicants are going to the State level before getting the local land use permits says that this applicant either doesn't understand proper procedure, or doesn't care, neither of which bode well for their future actions. Please deny this quarry application.

That acreage, if it is to be developed at all, would be better used for housing. Central City has already promised water and sewer taps for residential use. It would still destroy the area to develop it for housing, but the impacts would be so much more manageable and the damage more easy to mitigate.

Open pit strip mining can never be completely "reclaimed" out here in the arid West. Back East it can be recontoured, seeded, and not look too awful in a few decades, but out here the land doesn't recuperate well or easily.

Its bad enough that tourists, a major source of the two counties' economies, see the Frei Mine just as they are going into the high country. We don't need, nor can we afford, a second eye-sore strip operation destroying our bucolic mountain vistas.

Plus, the applicants want to mine hard rock gravel, but its never that simple. An in depth full EIS should be completed proving there aren't any heavy metals that would be disrupted and exposed to leach into the environment during their proposed mining. Its unacceptable to allow this project to create another Super Fund Site needing cleaned up by taxpayers who not only didn't gain anything from this mining operation, but actually lost too much to calculate (impacts on our quality of life, our environment, our own livelihoods, the destruction of the reasons we moved to these counties in the first place, etc.). Please deny this quarry.

How would the applicants deal with air quality? I don't want to have more particulates in the air. With no end in sight for the climate changes that are creating our drought conditions, where and how does the applicant plan to get water to knock the dust down? With the on-going water shortages, junior rights will be cut off more and more in the coming years. Are they proposing state of the art high tech filters, and so on, that will remove the dust instead? Without an iron-clad mandate of these problems being completely rectified and cured, as it goes along, not after operations cease, this project should not be allowed to happen.

A mandatory bond that will cover 100% of the clean up has to be included in any permitting process. Its important that there be no "Oops, sorry, but we can't pay for that" after it shuts down. Without safeguards like that, the project should not be Permitted.

The wildlife in that area is already overly stressed. The Big Horns are hanging on by a thread, already crowded out by the encroachment of human population and roads. There is no way to adequately mitigate the noise and additional disruption of habitat. The noise of a mining operation alone makes wildlife mitigation impossible, and that the project not be permitted.

They also must be held responsible for all run-off and groundwater pollution from open exposed granite. No excuses.

Then there's the increased heavy truck traffic that will destroy the roads there. The state and local governmental agencies should not have to rebuild and repair the damage. Its unacceptable to transfer those costs onto the local tax base, or even the state's.

With limited ingress and egress, it puts the local drivers at risk of life and limb. Who's responsible when (not if) residents are hit or killed by these heavy trucks? The area is not suited to this increased traffic.
