## **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted by Brock Bowles of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division). Martin Christensen of Four X Ranch, Inc. (Operator) was present for the inspection along with J.C. Kelley. The pit is located about 10 miles north of Fort Morgan. The site is an active 112c operation with 33.2 acres permitted and the post-mining land use is rangeland. At the time of the inspection it was partly cloudy, warm, breezy, and the ground was damp from a recent rain event.

This inspection was conducted at the requested of the operator who is considering selling the Four X Ranch Pit. Mr. Christensen wanted to meet with DRMS and the potential purchaser for a site evaluation of the reclamation cost estimate, review the permit requirements and to review the SO process.

The permit identification sign was in place at the mine entrance and legible (photo 1). Mining was taking place at the time of the inspection. A couple of front end loaders, some screening equipment, several product stockpiles and personnel were on site (photo 2).

The southern part of the disturbed area has been backfilled and graded. Some water has ponded in the low areas and needs to be regraded so the water can drain to the west (photo 3). As a reminder, the Div. of Water Resources requires any storm water runoff intercepted by this operation must infiltrate into the ground or be release to the stream system within 72 hours.

The last annual report submitted 5/10/2021 stated that the disturbed area consisted of 9.1 acres. This is consistent with the observed site conditions. The current bond held for the site is \$122,100 which is adequate to reclaim the entire 33.2 acre site. Since only 9.1 acres are disturbed, the bond is adequate to cover the current disturbance.
