## **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The J and K Limestone Products-Villa Grove Pit is located approximately three miles south of Villa Grove and accessed from Hwy 285. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 38.65 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$107,167.68 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is sufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.


The affected area was marked by fencing and posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Approximately 35 acres are disturbed by the operation. Materials stockpiles are located throughout the pit. Hauling was occurring during this inspection. The pit is approximately 30 feet in depth. Re-grading of the highwall to approximately 3H:1V has commenced in the south part of the pit.

Fuel storage was not observed on site.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
