Union Milling Contractors (UMC) has prepared the following response to the Incomplete 112c Application Package.

Exhibit D – Mining Plan – The mining plan submitted is incomplete. Please provide a mining plan that addresses each of the requirements of Rule 6.4.4.

Please provide the following:

1. Pursuant to Rule 6.4.4 (a): A description of the methods of mining to be employed in each stage of the operation as related to any surface disturbance.

#### <u>Response</u>

There will be no earth moving during operation. Earth moving will be limited to reclamation activities. Mining will be accomplished using a front-end loader, excavator, grizzly, classification screens and crusher

2. Pursuant to Rule 6.4.4 (b): A description of any earthmoving that will occur as part of the operation.

#### <u>Response</u>

No topsoil or overburden material will be excavated or removed from the mine site. Slag, depending on aggregate/ballast customer aggregate specifications, will be mined directly from designated slag piles (See Figure 4-12), or will excavated, passed through a -4-inch grizzly, and as necessary, screened to customer aggregate gradation specifications. Rejected material from the grizzly and screens will be stockpiled with existing stockpiles for future sales.

3. Pursuant to Rule 6.4.4 (c): A description of any water diversions or impoundments that will be part of the operation.

#### <u>Response</u>

No water diversions or impoundment will be constructed. (See Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) Stormwater Permit and CDRMS Drainage Plan (Appendix G-1) for best water management practices).

#### 4. Pursuant to Rule 6.4.4 (d): The size of areas to be worked at any one time.

#### <u>Response</u>

Areas to be mined will be dictated by customer aggregate specification and needs. Typically, areas to be worked at any one time are an area less than 200 sq feet. Areas where screening and stockpiles will be created that will occupy an area less than one (1) acre. The mining sequencing for the various stockpiles is illustrated on Figure 4-13.

# 5. Pursuant to Rule 6.4.4 (e): An approximate timetable to describe the mining operation. The timetable is for the purpose of establishing the relationship between mining and reclamation during the different phases of a mining operation.

#### <u>Response</u>

Leadville slag is devoid of vegetation. Topsoil for reclamation purposes is at the base of the slag. When slag is excavated to the top of the topsoil and an area greater than two (2) acres, reclamation activities (See Exhibit E-Reclamation) will commence.

### I. An estimate of the periods of time which will be required for the various stages or phases of the operation.

#### <u>Response</u>

The estimated time to mine slag stockpiles will be dictated by customer demands. The stockpiles to be mined may need be processed to meet end users' specifications. Ballast and aggregates are the major classified stockpiles. Stockpile A, C and E are "ballast" classified whereas "stockpile B, D, F, G and H are "aggregate" classified. (See Figure 4-13). Estimated gross annual production is estimated to range between 80,000 to 100,000 tons a year. Based on an annual production rate and location approximately one to two acres will be mined. At a production rate of 80,000 to a 100,000 ton per year the mine life is estimated to between 15 to 20 years.

#### II. A description of the size and location of each area to be worked during each phase.

#### <u>Response</u>

Annual ballast and aggregate production will affect no more than two acres. The location of mining sequencing is illustrated on Figure 4-13.

### III. iii. Outline the sequence in which each stage or phase of the operation will be carried out.

#### <u>Response</u>

The location of mining sequencing is illustrated on Figure 4-13.

### 6. Pursuant to Rule 6.4.4 (g): Identify the primary and secondary commodities to be mined/extracted and describe the intended use.

#### <u>Response</u>

The primary and only commodity to be mined is slag. The processed slag (grizzly and/or screened) will be used in concrete, asphalt, road base, pipeline bedding and end users requiring size fractions, greater than 3/8 inch (coarse sand and gravels) will be used in commodities such as rip rap, gabions, and check dams.

## 7. Pursuant to Rule 6.4.4 (h): Name and describe the intended use of any/all expected incidental products to be mined/extracted by the proposed operation.

#### <u>Response</u>

Most of the salable slag products will be used in construction and to a lesser degree for landscaping.

8. Pursuant to Rule 6.4.4 (j): Specify the dimensions of any existing or proposed roads that will be used for the mining operation. Describe any improvements necessary onexisting roads and the specifications to be used in the construction of new roads.

#### **Response**

Primary roads will be equal to or less than 30 feet wide whereas haul roads will range between 20 and 24 feet wide. (Figure 4-12 illustrates primary and haul road locations and widths)
