## **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) normal monitoring program. The October Ore Pile Reclamation site is a 110d Designated Mining Operation that consists of a half-acre permitted site. The site located four miles southwest of Gateway, Colorado. Craig Howell of Nuvemco, LLC. represented the operator. Amy Yeldell of the Division conducted the inspection. Brittany Cocina of the BLM was also present for this inspection.

The remains inactive and in temporary cessation (TC-2). The current period of temporary cessation expires on December 27, 2021. Prior to the Divisions inspection, discussions regarding site activity and the need for a second continuous period of temporary cessation had occurred. During the inspection further clarifications on filing requirements and general Board procedures were discussed. The Division has since received the TC request and the item has been placed on December's agenda.

The mine identification sign and affected area boundary markers are in place and in compliance with Rule 3.1.12. There are no structures, equipment or other mining related features on site. The ore stockpile and surrounding areas remains stable and no erosion was observed. Prior to resuming activity the stormwater BMP's (straw waddles) will need to be cleaned. Additional features may also be necessary depending on the timing of work. Vegetation surrounding the pile remains adequate and no weeds were observed. The Operator continues to take small samples for ongoing testing.

The Division has been made aware that the Operator is actively pursuing other permits with CDPHE. If granted the CDPHE permit the Operator is aware that additional permitting with DRMS and the BLM will be required prior to on site processing of the ore stockpile.

The Division currently requires a financial warranty amount of \$18,212 for this site. The bond was last increased in 2020 under SI. The Divisions has updated the reclamation cost estimate and found this amount to be sufficient to complete reclamation.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
