COMMENTS

A complete inspection was conducted by Rob Zuber of DRMS on March 3, 2022. Basil Bear of Bowie Resources, LLC (BRL) was present for the records check in the BRL office, but was not present for the field inspection.

No mining or reclamation activities were being conducted at this site. BRL is focusing on Bowie No. 2 in 2022.

Mr. Bear indicated that he is still considering options related to the fallen fence at the upper part of the East Mine.

The weather was cloudy and warm. The ground was covered with snow at the West Mine and muddy at the East Mine and Loadout.

AVAILABILITY OF RECORDS - Rule 5.02.4(1):

The records were found to be very well organized and complete. Please see the Availability of Records form in this report.

FISH and WILDLIFE – Rule 4.18:

Deer were seen at the Loadout, near the substation.

HYDROLOGIC BALANCE - Rule 4.05

Drainage Control 4.05.1, 4.05.2, 4.05.3; Siltation Structures 4.05.5, 4.05.6; Discharge Structures 4.05.7, 4.05.10; Diversions 4.05.4; Effluent Limits 4.05.2; Ground Water Monitoring 4.05.13; Surface Water Monitoring 4.05.13; Drainage – Acid and Toxic Materials 4.05.8; Impoundments 4.05.6, 4.05.9; Stream Buffer Zones 4.05.18:

The ponds at the loadout, the Coal Storage Area (near Black Bridge Road), and the West Mine were dry, and no problems were identified with these ponds. Riprap ditches at the East Mine are stable.

The Farmers Ditch was not flowing. Number of <u>Partial</u> Inspection this Fiscal Year: 4 Number of <u>Complete</u> Inspections this Fiscal Year: 3

ROADS - Rule 4.03

Construction 4.03.1(3)/4.03.2(3), Drainage 4.03.1(4)/4.03.2(4), Surfacing and Maintenance4.03.1(5) and (6)/4.03.2(5) and (6), Reclamation 4.03.1(7)/4.03.2(7):

Roads at the East Mine were not inspected closely due to muddy conditions; no signs of problems were seen from below. The road to the ROM area is in good shape.

RECLAMATION SUCCESS - Rule 4.15, Rule 3:

No erosion was seen at the reclaimed areas of the East Mine, including:

- The main area along the haul road and around the old portals
- The Refuse Disposal Area (RDA)
- The Old Waste Disposal Area
- The drainage where the reclaimed ponds (Ponds 1-4) are located.

REVEGETATION – Rule 4.15 Vegetative Cover; Timing:

At the first bend in the haul road west of the RDA (across the valley from the ROM), the slope below the road was inspected. It was generally stable, but a bare spot was seen near the bottom (edge of disturbed area). BRL should use silt fence, erosion logs, or other practices to prevent erosion at this location.

SLIDES and DAMAGE - Rule 4.12:

The slope around the fallen fence at the upper part of the East Mine was stable.

SIGNS AND MARKERS – Rule 4.02:

Entrance signs and boundary markers were seen in many locations.

OFFSITE SUPPORT FACILIITES - Rule 4.04, 4.28:

No problems were seen with the Coal Storage Area by Black Bridge Road.

The slope below the Loadout is stable. No erosion or other problems were seen there. Some trash, equipment, and branches were seen at the Loadout, and BRL should remove the trash and branches in the near future.
