Rob Zuber, I have searched our records and found a summary of a 2011 telephone conversation between our staff and a consultant with Rare Earth Science discussing the Bowie number 2 permit renewal. The only other entry in the record is a 2012 notation that the record was closed due to inactivity. Therefore, I have concluded that no Endangered Species Act section 7 consultation was completed in 2012 as indicated in your letter. Although we discussed the potential for no effect conclusion in 2012 regarding activity at the mine site, I cannot confirm that information.

Since the 2012 communication regarding Bowie #2, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service listed the Yellow-billed Cuckoo (*Coccyzus americanus*), and designated critical habitat. The species or its critical habitat may be present near the Bowie #2 mine. I recommend you utilize our Information for Planning and Consultation online system to assist you in determining if the

permitted activities at the mine may affect any federally listed species or designated critical habitat. It is the responsibility of the action agency to determine what effects may occur to federally listed species and designated critical habitat from from its actions. If you believe that the activities occurring under the permitted action will not affect federally listed species, section 7 consultation is not required.
