This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. 
The JD-6 Mine is located approximately nine miles west of Naturita and accessed from EE19 road. The site is a 110d operation that includes a total of 6.24 permitted acres.

There has been no recent activity at this site. Conditions appear similar to those observed during past inspections. The repaired retaining wall continues to appear stable. Stormwater control structures appear to be maintained and functional. No problems or violations were noted during this inspection. Final reclamation has not yet commenced.
