RE: Cross Gold Mine, Permit No. M-1977-410, Request for Approval for Cross Shaft Surface Depression Remediation.

Mr. Lennberg,

As discussed during your Site Inspection this past Friday June 3, 2022, and pursuant with Mined Land Reclamation Board Cease and Desist Order imposed and current to Grand Island Resources (GIR), we hereby request approval to perform reclamation of a surface feature consisting of a land depression that has the potential of increasing surface water influx into the underground workings of the Cross Mine.

The proposed work consists of re-establishing the natural surface topography and natural surface drainage via backfilling, slope, topsoil placement, and revegetation, in accordance with Amendment #2.

The depression and nearby area proposed for reclamation are within GIR's current approved permit area. Access for reclamation activities would be via an existing mine road located along the boundary of GIR's approved disturbance zone.

GIR would like to perform backfill activities during the summer months of the current year such that snow accumulation within the depression and subsequent infiltration are prevented.

The following photographs depict the depression to be remediated.



GIR would appreciate approval by DRMS to proceed with the remediation.
