GENERAL INSPECTION TOPICS

OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division's routine monitoring program for permitted operations. Nikie Gagnon and Jason Musick, with the Division, conducted the inspection and was joined by Mike Wolf, representing the Operator Todd Creek Village Metropolitan District (Todd Creek). The Signal Reservoir No. 1 Expansion is a construction materials 111 permit associated with a reservoir expansion project. The permit is approved to affect 30 acres within the footprint of an existing reservoir controlled by Todd Creek. Signal Reservoir No. 1, which was dry at the time of the inspection, is just northwest of Signal Reservoir No. 2, which was full at the time of the inspection.

The site is located 6 miles east of the junction of I-25 and East 168 Ave between Quebec Street and Yosemite Street. The pit entrance is about 500 feet south of E 168 Ave and is immediately north of Signal Reservoir No. 2.

<u>General Mine Plan Compliance</u>: Mining activity has not begun at the site. Mr. Wolf stated Todd Creek does not have any immediate plans to begin mining. To avoid unnecessary inspections, the Division asks the Operator make a commitment to notify DRMS via email or a phone call when mining operations commence at the site. With this commitment, the Division will change the inspection frequency to 48 months, unless a complaint is received. Once mining begins at Signal Reservoir No. 1, the frequency will revert to 12 months.

Financial Warranty:

The Division holds a \$75,000.00 bond for the site. The financial warranty was reviewed as a part of the inspection and the Division has determined the bond is adequate.

Signs and Markers:

The permit sign was posted at the entrance to the site as required by Rule 3.1.12(1). Upon arrival for the inspection, Mike Wolf gave the Division printed photographs of each boundary marker which included GPS coordinates for each location. The date/time stamp on the photos indicate the points were taking earlier in the day.








