This letter is to provide response to your letter dated May 12, 2022 regarding the Permit M-1999-006 Succession of Operator No. 2 (SO-02) Incomplete Application Notification. Below is a summary of the actions completed in response to the incomplete applications.

Additional Requested Items	Response
Please include an Affidavit of Authority to Execute Financial Warranty Documents. An executed, notarized original signed by Kevin Jeakins must be submitted to the Division.	An electronic copy of the Affidavit of Authority to Execute Financial Warranty Documents is attached as Attachment A. The original document was overnighted to your attention on July 11, 2022.
An original of the Financial Warranty is required. The submittal only included a photocopy, which is not sufficient.	The original Financial Warranty document was overnighted to your attention on July 7, 2022.
The submittal did not include a Demonstration of Legal Right to Enter. This documentation must be provided for the Prospective Successor (Raptor Materials LLC).	The application included an executed property deed from Varra to Raptor Materials LLC. Per Item 5 Filing Requirements for SO Application this is an appropriate document. The provided deed covers the entirety of the project area.



Additional Requested Items	Response
A comprehensive review of structures within 200 feet of affected land should be conducted and should include any new structures that were not addressed with previous reviews.	Based on a review of the most recent aerial photographs (June 2021) and county land records available through the Weld County Property Portal there are no new structures within 200 feet of the affected land.
The submittal must include Structure Agreements between structure owners and Raptor Materials LLC, or it must include documentation of efforts to obtain these agreements.	During the initial permit application Varra Companies Inc provided an engineer's certification in lieu of Structure Agreements. As such no notification is needed.

Documentation of Legal Authority to Execute Financial Warranty Documents

The Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board ("Board") has adopted the attached Affidavit of Authority to Execute Financial Warranty Documents pursuant to the Mined Land Reclamation Act (C.R.S. § 34-32-101 et. seq.) and the Land Reclamation Act for the Extraction of Construction Materials (C.R.S. § 34-32.5-101 et. seq.). The Board and the Division of Reclamation Mining and Safety ("Division") have determined that, in order to carry out the financial warranty requirements set forth in C.R.S. §§ 34-32-117 and 34-32.5-117 with reasonable diligence, it is prudent to verify the legal authority of the individual signing all necessary documents.

Accordingly, you must provide confirmation of the legal authority of the individual signing all Financial Warranty Documents to the Division. You may do so either by submitting a resolution of the decision-making body of your company that authorizes an individual to sign the Financial Warranty Documents on the company's behalf, or by completing and notarizing the attached affidavit. The Division reserves the right to require the attached affidavit in all circumstances. Please note that if you are a sole proprietor who is executing documents on your own behalf, documentation of legal authority is unnecessary.
