OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate conditions observed.

The Greer Pit is located approximately 2.7 miles west of Marvel and accessed from CR 100. The site is a 110c operation that includes a total of 8.3 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$12,721.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is sufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing and berms that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Most of the permit area has been disturbed by mining. Reclamation grading has occurred on the east highwall. The pit daylights to the north. Mining is continuing in the south highwall area where limited reserves remain. The highwall is approximately 30 feet high and near vertical. Topsoil is stockpiled in the pit and above the west highwall. Processed materials stockpiles are located in the pit.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
