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## **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate conditions observed.

The Rock Dog #1 site is located approximately ten miles southeast of Durango and accessed from CR 309. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 224.2 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$137,842.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is sufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing and posts adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Roughly 25 acres are currently disturbed at the site. The existing disturbance is located in the Phase C area and is progressing southward through the Phase B area towards the Phase A area. The highwall slope on the east side of the Phase C and B areas is graded to approximately 2H:1V and vegetation is becoming well established on the slope. The highwall on the south end of the pit is roughly ten feet high and 1H:1V.

Sand and gravel stockpiles are located within the pit. Overburden and topsoil are stored in berms around the pit perimeter.

Overall, the site is orderly and no problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
