

- 4. Any modification to the approved mining and reclamation plan from those described in your approved application requires you to submit a permit modification and obtain approval from the Board or Office;
- 5. It is your responsibility to notify the Office of any changes in your address or phone number;
- 6. Upon permit issuance and prior to beginning on-site mining activity, you must post a sign at the entrance of the mine site, which shall be clearly visible from the access road, with the following information (Rule 3.1.12):
 - a. the name of the operator;
 - b. a statement that a reclamation permit for the operation has been issued by the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board; and,
 - c. the permit number.
- 7. The boundaries of the permit boundary area must be marked by monuments or other markers that are clearly visible and adequate to delineate such boundaries prior to site disturbance.
- 8. It is a provision of this permit that the operations will be conducted in accordance with the terms and conditions listed in your application, as well as with the provisions of the Act and the Construction Material Rules and Regulations in effect at the time the permit is issued.
- 9. Annually, on the anniversary date of permit issuance, you must submit an annual fee as specified by Statute, and an annual report which includes a map describing the acreage affected and the acreage reclaimed to date (if there are changes from the previous year), any monitoring required by the Reclamation Plan to be submitted annually on the anniversary date of the permit approval. Annual fees are for the previous year a permit is held. For example, a permit with the anniversary date of July 1, 1995, the annual fee is for the period of July 1, 1994 through June 30, 1995. Failure to submit your annual fee and report by the permit anniversary date may result in a civil penalty, revocation of your permit, and forfeiture of your financial warranty. It is your responsibility, as the permittee, to continue to pay your annual fee to the Office until the Board releases you from your total reclamation responsibility.



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HAROLD EICHMAN PIT (M-1985-105) MINING PLAN MAP 19.21 ACRES SCALE: 1" = 166.6'




EXHIBIT D Harold Eichman Pit M-1985_105 MINING PLAN

A tracked dozer or front-end loader working from west to east or south to north will push the sand and gravel being mined in this operation into a stockpile. A front-end loader will then load the material from the stockpile into haul trucks. Some of the sand and gravel could remain in the stockpile for several weeks. The sand and gravel will be utilized in the maintenance and construction of county roads in District 3 of Lincoln County.

Prior to removal of the sand and gravel 3 to 5 inches of topsoil will be stockpiled for later use in the reclamation of the affected lands. These topsoil stockpiles will be hand seeded to stabilize the piles and prevent erosion (see attached memo from Brian Johnson N.R.C.S. for seed to be used, amounts and seeding seasons.) Any overburden that underlies the topsoil will either be used as binder or stockpiled for later use in the reclamation. These stockpiles will also be hand seeded for stabilization and to prevent erosion. The maximum size area that will be mined at one time would be from 7 to 9 acres.

This operation will be active but will be used les than 180 days per year.

The over burden to be removed is a mix of soil and sand and gravel that gets sandier with increasing depth. The sand and gravel to be mined varies in thickness from 7 to 15 feet. The material that under lays the sand and gravel is a mix of clay and sand that turns to clay a great depth.

The primary commodity being extracted is sand and gravel. No incidental products will be mined. No processing of the material will occur in the pit area. The only water used in the pit area would be for dust abatement.

No explosives are used in either the mining or reclamation.

Reclamation Plan

When construction material has been depleted, all areas will be re-graded to form a 3:1 slope that blends in with the undisturbed adjacent ground. The grade will also be sloped on the North and South side of Pond Creek to restore the streambed. Mining of material in the bed has been executed deeper than the original streambed outside of the affected area. Subsequent rain events will cause sediment to be deposited in the streambed of the affected area, eventually leveling the bed to the same grade as the bed in the unaffected area.

Additional imported topsoil material will likely be required to provide quantities sufficient to allow for adequate revegetation of the site. Three to four inches of topsoil will be used to cover the entire reclaimed area (except for the streambed).

Supplementing the plant growth medium with 10-20 tons per acre of organic matter (composed manure) will be part of the reclamation process. As needed, compacted areas will be ripped and disked prior to revegetation.

Measures taken to re-vegetate the site will be in accordance with the seed mix recommended by the NRCS.

Pine Creek is dry most of the time , there is no running water in it at all unless it rains a good amount. We will not use any of the water from the creek if there is any in it. There will be no dust control for the haul roads or inside the pit.

Pine Creek starts just above of where the new expansion will be located and then runs through part of the existing part of the original pit.

Exhibit J (Vegetation Information)

With the sandy gravel and lack of topsoil, Graminoids are the most common and obvious vegetation, and are included in the approved seed mix in the reclamation plan. Some Sagebrush and Yucca are present. The vegetation is sparse given the non-habitable growth medium. This sparse vegetation is evident on the imagery map labeled exhibit C.

Exhibit K (Climate)

The climate of the area has characteristic features of low relative humidity, abundant sunshine, infrequent rain and snow, moderate to high wind movement, and a large daily and seasonal range in temperature. Summer daily maximum temperatures are often 95°F or above. Winter extremes are generally between 0 and -15°F.

Average annual precipitation is between ten and twenty inches. Most of this precipitation falls in the form soaking rains in April through early June or as intense bursts from thunderstorms in June through August. Year-to-year precipitation is highly variable and highly dependent on the number of large rain events in late spring and summer. Summer thunderstorms may be severe, with hail being the most common threat.

Some topsoil will be imported along with composted materials to help with the reclamation process. The only cost for that will be the trucking as the other is provided by local ranchers and farmers.

We will drill the seed in the slopes of the pit and do hand seeding where it is needed. Seed rates will be around 20 lbs to the acre.

Total cost should be close to 3000 dollars since the equipment is owned by the county and the employees are there also.



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

On 28 June 2022, the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS) received a 112 Construction Materials Reclamation Permit Conversion (CN1), Application package from Lincoln County for the Harold Eichman Gravel Pit File No. M1985105. The operation is anticipated to be active for 10 years, from 2022 through 2023. The post mining land use specified is general agriculture. The Division received the conversion fee for a 112 operation as required.

The Division reviewed your application to determine whether it is adequate to meet the requirements of the Act, upon submittal of all required items. On 11 July 2022 the application was deemed incomplete for lack of a public notice at the entrance. The operator provided proof that the notice was posted at the site entrance, and the application was deemed complete at the end of the day on 11 July 2022.

Preliminary adequacy was provided on 13 July 2022. A partial response to preliminary adequacy was conducted over the phone on 22 July 2022. DRMS requested that outstanding adequacy pages be mailed to the Division. DRMS received an email with revised pages on 4 August 2022. A second adequacy was provided 19 August 2022 and Lincoln County responded with revised exhibit pages via email.

Adequacy items successfully addressed in previous adequacy letters are not listed below.

Rule 1.6.4 Specific Provision 112 Reclamation Permit Application DRMS 21 August

DRMS finds that proper notice and publication were not adequately completed. As this is a conversion from a 110c to a 112 permit the public notice requirement as per Rule 1.6.2(1)(d) must be published four times, once each week over the course of four weeks and as stated in DRMS's 12 July 2022 email. DRMS received a photograph of a public notice on 9 September 2022 after requesting the affidavit of publication, however the information in the notice was inadequate and the notice was published for two not four weeks.

1. Please submit affidavit of publication that displays the content of the public notice as well as publication dates as per Rule 1.6.5(2) to DRMS via email and mail to the DRMS mailing address.

Rule 1.4 (13) Application Review

As notice was initially published for two weeks rather than four weeks, an extension of the decision date is required and must be requested.

1. Please submit an extension request in writing on Lincoln County Letterhead via email. The extension should be requested to 18 November 2022 (or so), to assure that proper notification has been achieved and a 20 day comment period has elapsed. Please provide this document at your earliest convenience to DRMS.

The Division has no further questions regarding the above referenced permitting action.
