# **OBSERVATIONS**

The Caldwell-Nesselhuf Pit No. 1 was inspected by Patrick Lennberg and Amber Michels with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS). The inspection was completed as part of the Division's routine monitoring program. The site was last inspected by the Division on September 17, 2019 for a preoperation inspection related to Amendment 1 (AM-1). Jodi Schriber representing the Operator, All-Rite Paving and Redi-Mix, Inc., accompanied us during the inspection. The weather was clear but there had been recent snow fall in the area.

The site is 112c Construction Materials permit for 199.4 acres with all permitted acres approved to be affected. It is located in Crowley County, approximately 1.5 miles north of Manzanola, and 0.5 miles east of the junction of CO 207 with Co Rd A 5/10. The land is owned by Gail Zimmerman and has a gated entrance off of Co Rd A 5/10. A mine sign was posted at the primary mine entrance as required by Rule 3.1.12. The post-mining land use for this site is rangeland.

The site was active at the time of inspection. A crew was preparing the site to begin washing operations. Since the last inspection mining disturbance has increased from 12.6 acres to approximately 22 acres. Disturbed areas are approaching the permit boundary along the southwest fence line. The disturbances approaching the permit boundary had some material replaced along the former highwall in an effort to begin reclamation. Topsoil has been stripped and stockpiled in the area located north of the pit area.

There are three power-poles where the Operator has completed mining or is currently mining around. It appears the Operator is maintaining a 50 foot buffer around the base of the poles as was committed to in AM-1. Around one pole, where the Operator has completed mining, the slopes have been graded to approximately 3H:1V slope and vegetation is becoming established along the slopes. It does not appear that there is more than 100 feet of highwall exposed.

At the southern end of the disturbance area the berm, marking the 200 foot buffer from the Arkansas River, was inspected. The berm appears to be in good condition and stable. The previous disturbed areas that were reclaimed in establishing the 200 foot buffer appear to have vegetation becoming established. Also along the southern disturbance area are three wash ponds. The eastern most pond was being filled during the inspection from water being pumped from an onsite well located approximately 190 feet to the south. The side slopes of the ponds appear to be stable but the Division did note that Tamarisks (Salt Cedar) were growing in each of the ponds. The Operator was informed they should eradicate the plants before they become established.

The 2,000 gallon AST that was on-site during the last inspection and noted on the AM-1 Mining Plan Map has been removed from the site. The Operator also informed the Division that the scale house was recently replaced with a newer portable scale house. The scale house is located near the mine entrance along a haul road that is approximately 2.2 acres in size.

The Division evaluated the financial warranty and determined the current bond amount held by the Division is adequate at this time.
