## Re: Incompleteness Notice No. 4, Conversion Application (CN-1), Gold Hill Mill, Permit No. M-1994-117

Mr. Langenfeld:

On December 27, 2022, the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS) received your responses to the Division's Incompleteness Notice dated December 14, 2022 for the Conversion Application for the Gold Hill Mill, File No. M-1994-117. Review of the submitted responses determined the following item must be received before the Division can consider the application as being submitted/file and technical review can begin.

## EXHIBIT I – Proof of Filing with County Clerk and Recorder (Rule 6.3.9):

 The Division reviewed the letter that was sent to the Boulder County Clerk and Recorders Office and the text incorrectly identifies the name of the mining operation to be Delta Paving Sand and Gravel Pit. Please update the letter with the correct mine operation name, resubmit the Incompleteness Responses No. 3 to the Boulder County Clerk and Recorders Office and provide a demonstration, pursuant to Rule 1.6.2(1)(c), the materials are available for public review.

Your Conversion Application will not be considered filed until the information listed above is received and found sufficient to begin our review. If you have already published notice you will need to republish notice, but only after the Division considers the application complete and filed; the Division will notify you when you should initiate publication of your notice. This notice must be published once starting ten (10) days of the date your application is considered filed. The final date for receiving comments is the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) day after the date of publication or the next regular business day.

Pursuant to Rule 1.4.1(8), you have sixty (60) days from the date of this letter to submit all necessary documents that the Division needs for an application to be considered filed. If, at the end of the sixty day period, the application has not been determined to be filed with the Division, the Division may deny the application and terminate the application file. Should additional time be required to submit all the necessary documents an extension request can be submitted in writing for the Division's consideration.
