OBSERVATIONS

The Perdue site was inspected by Patrick Lennberg with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS). The inspection was completed as part of priority inspection to assess the conditions of the site since the Board Order was signed on December 8, 2022. The site was previously inspected by the Division on June 9, 2022 as part of the Division's routine monitoring program. Doug Ruppel representing the current land owner met me at the site. The weather was clear.

The Perdue site is a 110c operation permitted for 9.7 acres. The permit is for the mining of sandstone for building materials and decorative use. The mine is located in Boulder County and the site entrance is located approximately 3 miles north of Lyons, CO via Stone Canyon Drive. The approved post-mining land use is rangeland. A mine sign was posted at the mine entrance pursuant to Rule 3.1.12.

Conditions at the site have not changed since the last inspection. During the inspection Mr. Ruppel stated that full disclosure of the mining permit conditions and permit history did not occur as it was supposed to have occurred during the land sale. The Division did inform the new land owner that stone material may be used onsite but no stone materials may leave the site. If materials do leave the site the Division may find the land owner in violation of operating mining operation without a permit.

The approved reclamation plan calls for backfilling mined areas with overburden and/or waste rock to a 3H:1V or flatter slope gradient, replacing topsoil on disturbed land at a minimum depth of 3 inches, and revegetating the site for rangeland use. The existing driveway used to access the site from Stone Canyon Drive is to remain after reclamation. There are several steep mine faces that need to backfilled in the southeast and southwestern areas of the permit. Along with backfilling, any available topsoil needs to spread and seeded with approved seed mix. Additionally, there are several piles and stacks of marketable material that remain onsite.

The permit is scheduled for the next Board Hearing, which is March 22, 2023. During the hearing the Division will seek a violation for failure to comply with the conditions of an order, permit or regulation and for failure to submit the required annual report, map and fee.
