Copies of revision pages modified during the review process must be distributed in the same manner, along with proof of distribution. Proof of distribution must be submitted prior to implementation of the revision.

Endangered or Threatened Species

Periodic review of threatened and endangered species (T&E) and their Delta County habitats is required. The T&E species lists provided on the Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) websites were reviewed for inclusion in Minor Revision-32. The CPW site listed species in the state of Colorado and the USFWS site listed species found in Delta County Colorado. There are no plans to expand the TCC coal handling facilities at this time. In fact, all screening and associated transportation facilities were removed in 2015 and operations have ceased.

The USFWS site describes eleven T&E species and one candidate that may occur in Delta County. None of these species has been discovered on the TCC property.

Yellow-billed Cuckoo is listed as federally threatened. Populations are believed to occur in parts of Western Colorado as well as in many other western states.

<u>Gunnison sage-grouse</u> is listed as federally threatened. Populations are believed to occur in parts of Central Western Colorado and in parts of Eastern Utah.

Mexican Spotted Owl is listed as federally threatened. Populations are believed to occur in Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, Texas, and Utah

Colorado pikeminnow, is listed as federally endangered. These populations are known to exist in offsite areas in the lower parts of the Gunnison River. No populations are known to appear near TCC.

Razorback sucker and Humpback chub are listed as federally endangered. These populations are known to exist in offsite areas in the lower parts of the Gunnison River. No populations are known to appear near TCC.

Bonytail chub is listed as federally endangered. Populations are known to exist in offsite areas in the Gunnison River. No populations are known to appear near TCC. **Hookless cactus** is listed as federally threatened and is known to exist between Montrose and Grand Junction. TCC operation has no effect on this species.

<u>Clay-Loving wild buckwheat</u> is listed as federally endangered and is found between Montrose and Delta. The TCC operation has no effect on this species.

Parachute beardtongue is listed as federally threatened and is found in Colorado. No populations are known to appear near TCC.

Canada Lynx is listed as federally threatened. There is no suitable habitat for the Canada Lynx located at or near TCC.

Monarch Butterfly is noted as a federal candidate. Populations are believed to occur in parts of Western Colorado as well as in many other western states as they migrate from Canada to Mexico. No populations are known to appear near TCC.

Based upon current information for these twelve species, the continued existence of the TCC property will not adversely affect or contribute to a loss of viability for any of these T&E or candidate species or their habitats.
