OBSERVATIONS

This was a routine monitoring inspection conducted Brock Bowles of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division). Danny Ausmus of Baca County (Operator) was present for the inspection. The weather during the inspection was sunny and warm with a light breeze. The ground was dry.

The mine entrance was in place facing CR 23 (photo 1). All permit boundary markers were in place. No mining was taking place and no equipment was on site. The product stockpiles were located in the middle of the pit area (photo 2).

The slopes of the pit area were mined to 3h:1v. The slopes to the north had been reclaimed (photo 3). The mine is advancing to the east and the slopes are also mined to 3h:1v. Topsoil was stored to the west (photo 4) and south of the pit area and were well vegetated.

No standing water was in the pit area and no noxious weeds were noted.


