Sorry about my confusion! I just got off the phone with Austin Clennins (leasing the pit) and he confirmed that the markers you two walked are the boundary markers of the pit as shown on the survey. There are t posts and permanent survey markers at each corner. He also wanted me to let you know that the pit is totally dry now, with the warmer weather. He also did some skid work last week to allow for drainage.

Ashley,

Just to clarify, the markers around the pit are the only ones on-site? I've attached a Google Earth map with the survey markers (65-71) and the markers taken during the 2019 inspection (blue flags with PP 1-7) and the markers Austin took me to during our last inspection (yellow pins 3, 20, 23, and 30). The points taken during the 2019 inspection were from the t-posts around the pit, and since they were not placed at the actual permit boundary, a survey was requested to put the boundary markers at the permit boundaries per Rule 3.1.12(2)(a). It looks like the ones I observed were the same as those observed during the 2019 inspection.

On the survey, it says that boundary markers are placed at points 65-71. I believe Austin had mentioned that there were steaks in the ground at the survey points in-case t-posts were to be damaged or fall down. Are there steaks at the survey points 65-71? If so, photos of those markers in-place will satisfy the Rule, and the ones that are around the pit may remain to ensure that active mining stays within that area.
