Dear Hunter:

On behalf of West Fish Creek Ranch, LLC, please see the responses, provided below in blue text, to the items identified on the Technical Revision (TR-3), Adequacy Review #2 dated 8/21/2023.

1) Please clarify what the use of the sediment pond is to be in final reclamation. Is it expected that the pond will still function as a sediment pond in final reclamation or will it be left for another use?

Response: Yes, the pond will remain as a vegetated sediment trap for stormwater management after final reclamation. The extraction site will be graded to direct stormwater runoff from the upper bench towards the sediment pond/trap.

2) The Division has identified an area included in the original permit boundary which has been omitted as part of the proposed boundary adjustment in TR3. This area is approximated to be about 0.60 acres (Google Earth measurement imagery attached). While it is understood that this permit as well as adjoining areas outside the permit boundary have been mined under pre-law conditions, google earth imagery (attached) suggests that this southern, 0.60 acre area has been disturbed since formal permitting of the site in 1979. This area is included within the original permit boundary and therefore no violations for mining outside of the permit boundary have occurred. However, while this area looks to be visibly re-vegetated, the Division still would need to formally release any areas disturbed by permitted mining operations before it can be removed from the permit boundary. Please provide clarification on the history of this southern area. If the

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area has been disturbed since 1979, please include this 0.60 acres within the proposed permit boundary.

Response: The proposed new boundary has been updated to include the previously disturbed area in the SE portion of the upper bench. Revised Mining and Reclamation Plan Maps are attached reflecting this change.




