COMMENTS

This was a partial inspection of the Seneca IIW Mine, C1982057, operated by Seneca Property LLC. The inspection was conducted, images analyzed and the report prepared by me, Robin Reilley of the DRMS. Kevin Copeland, mine representative, was present throughout the inspection. No hydrologic or air quality issues were detected at the time of inspection. The weather was clear and calm with temperatures around 70 degrees Fahrenheit.

PERMITTING ACTIONS in PROGRESS: None at this time.

MAINTENANCE ISSUES IDENTIFIED Culvert above pond 6 requires cleaning.

OUTSTANDING MAINTENANCE

- 1. Flume at Pond 15 requires resetting.
- 2. Slide at Pond 6 requires mitigation plan

GENERAL MINE PLAN COMPLIANCE:

Reclamation is complete and executed as permitted. Approximately 106.2 acres of Phase I released acres remain for bond release. These acres comprise the main haul road, Pond 6 and the slide area above; Ponds 15 and 16 and slide area on the east side of the site. Year nine vegetation sampling of the above mentioned areas occurred in August 2022. Reclamation appears stable with well established vegetation.

• Haul roads and access roads were dry and in good repair, providing access to the entire site

HYDROLOGIC BALANCE- Rule 4.05

Ponds and stock tanks held water, and some ponds were discharging at the time of inspection. Pond banks and dam outslopes were in good repair and well vegetated.

SLIDES and OTHER DAMAGE- Rule 4.12

Established slump at Pond 6 was noted. The new slide (spring 2023), downstream from the slump appears to encompass approximately 1/3 of an acre. A crack exists between the two areas.

REVEGETATION - Rule 4.15

Perennial vegetation appeared well established on the slopes above the Pond 6 inlet. Shrubs and tree appeared well established with the exception of the Aspens. Vegetation is well established, diverse and mature throughout the site.

FISH and WILDLIFE-RULE 4.18

Waterfowl on the ponds was observed throughout the Seneca IIW mine site.
