RE: Thunderbird Sand and Gravel, File No. M-2023-032, New 112c Permit Application, Request for Technical Review

On October 3, 2023, a new 112c Permit Application was filed with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) for the Thunderbird Sand and Gravel mine, submitted by Martin Marietta Materials, Inc. The proposed mine is located in Pueblo County, approximately 0.6 miles south of U.S. Hwy 50 and Pueblo city limits, adjacent to and east of Baxter Road, just north of the Arkansas River. The proposed permit area is 543.5 acres. The property and the substance to be mined are owned by TXI Operations, LP, a wholly owned subsidiary of Martin Marietta Materials.

The application proposes 3 major stages of the operation, including phase 1 in which site development and establishment of the processing plant will occur, phase 2 in which the eastern cell, 130.9 acres in size, will be lined (with a combination slurry wall/clay liner) and mined, and phase 3 in which the western cell, 50.2 acres in size, will be lined (with a combination slurry wall/clay liner) and mined. The application states the two cells will be mined to 200 feet from the river, then backfilled to 400 feet from the river. The proposed post-mining land use is developed water resource. The proposed reclamation plan includes leaving 2 lined water storage reservoirs and revegetating all disturbed lands outside of the reservoirs with grasses.

The Division determined this application to be "complex", which extended the application decision date by 60 days. This gives an application decision date of March 2, 2024. The public comment period for this application is set to close on November 23, 2023. A pre-operation inspection of the proposed affected lands will be conducted after the public comments period closes, currently anticipated to occur within the first 2 weeks of December.
