Hi Tim,

From Lithos: The buttressed slope on the south side of the FMIC ditch road is in question. The sideslopes within the FMIC ditch appear stable. A few erosion gullies on the buttress slope have progressed to be quite deep (deepening into the buttress slope). The stability of the buttress slope appears to be at risk and if left unrepaired, the ditch is also at risk. We recommend the damaged areas of the buttress slope be repaired as soon as possible (backfilled with compacted soil) and be seeded/vegetation per the approved reclamation plan.

Several repairs have been completed on the buttress slope within the last year but there are numerous locations that still need to be repaired and seeded. Per the last site visit, the recent repairs still have not been seeded. Holcim intends to continue sloping work and seeding in the spring.
