OBSERVATIONS

This was an inspection for the Golden Mine, a 70.15 acre 112c clay mine, conducted by Eric Scott of DRMS. On January 17, 2024 Denver Brick requested that the Golden Mine be placed into Temporary Cessation (TC) status to allow the permittee to pursue additional required permitting with Jefferson County. DRMS sent out the required notices of TC consideration to the county and municipalities within 2 miles as required on January 18, 2024. To date, no comments or objections have been received by the Division. This inspection was conducted by DRMS to verify the current condition of the site and the adequacy of the existing bond prior to placing the request for TC on the Consent Agenda for the February 21, 2024 MLRB hearing.

The site is located within State of Colorado property which is bounded by Hwy 93 to the east, the City of Golden to the South, private residential property on the west (other side of the hogback ridge), and State property containing previously reclaimed clay mining sites to the north. DRMS accessed the site from the gated entrance to the permit area located further west along the site access road.

It was noted that the site identification sign was present (photo 1) and that the permit boundary, including access roads, was clearly marked by T-posts with white PVC pipe placed over them. There was no mining activity taking place during the inspection, and no mining equipment present on site (photos 2-4). No product stockpile was present during this inspection. DRMS noted that the conditions on-site are essentially unchanged from the time the permit conversion was approved by the MLRB and therefore the existing reclamation bond is still adequate. Denver Brick needs to secure proper permitting from Jefferson County prior to commencing expanded mining operations. Therefore, DRMS will place the request for Temporary Cessation status on the Consent Agenda for the February 21, 2024 MLRB hearing unless objections are received.

No other issues were noted during this inspection.
