Dear Mr. McCourt,

The Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (the Division) has finished reviewing the 2023 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs). The monitoring reports were received by the Division on January 30, 2024. The Division finds the reports to be in compliance with the following Rules:

- **Rule 4.05.13(2)(i)** Samples are measured accurately and record the quality and quantity of the water discharged from the permit area.
- Rule 4.05.13(2)(ii) There are three outfalls associated with the COG850001 permit; Outfall 001, Outfall 002 and Outfall 003. During the months of October, November and December Outfalls 001, 002 and 003 did not discharge. Therefore, no exceedances occurred.
- Rule 4.05.13(2)(iii) Discharge Monitoring Reports are received on a quarterly basis and filed with the Division within 90 days of the sample collection.
