OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate conditions observed.

The North R-34 Pit is located approximately 2.5 miles northwest of Montrose and accessed from La Salle Road. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 37.4 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$23,380.00 for this site. The Division will review the reclamation costs in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan. The Operator will be notified under separate cover if the Division determines that the current financial warranty amount is insufficient.

There has been no additional mining since the Division's last inspection. Mining disturbance is still contained within the Phase 1 area. The pond includes approximately 2.5 acres. The pond slopes have been mined at approximately 2H:1V. The area on the east side of the pond, approximately one acre, has been graded level and appeared to be a stockpile/staging area. Topsoil is stockpiled in the northwest corner of the Phase 1 area. The Phase 2 area is not yet disturbed.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing and posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

There was no fuel or other hazardous materials stored on site.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
