OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate conditions observed.

The Haldorson Sand and Gravel Mine is located approximately 2.5 miles northwest of Montrose and accessed from 6175 Road. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 180.27 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$306,730.00 for this site. The Division will review the reclamation costs in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan. The Operator will be notified under separate cover if the Division determines that the current financial warranty amount is insufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing that was clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Topsoil is stockpiled in a visual berm around the perimeter of the site on the north and west sides. The topsoil piles are vegetated and appear adequately stabilized.

The asphalt and concrete plants are located in the east side of the pit. Fuel stored in these areas is adequately contained. No problems were noted related to these areas.

Slopes around the pit range from approximately 1H:1V to 2H:1V and appear stable. A section of near vertical highwall, approximately 400 lf, exists at the south end of the pit where mining is progressing southward.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
