Mr. Courtney,

On March 13, 2024, the Division received your letter of correspondence sent in regards to Division comments made on a site inspection report dated February 2024 The Division initially requested that the South Asphalt Plant apply for its second period of Temporary Cessation as per Rule 1.13.5(3) and Rule 1.13.8(b). Your letter outlined Rocky Mountain Materials and Asphalt, Inc.'s justification for why a second period of Temporary Cessation at the site was not warranted.

On March 25, 2024, the Division met virtually with site representatives Phil Courtney and Julie Mikulas to discuss the matter. Upon conclusion of this meeting, it was determined that filing for Intermittent Status, as per C.R.S. 34-32.5-103(11)(b), would be the best way to account for the site's infrequent operation, rather than applying for continued Temporary Cessation status. The Operator is reminded that should intermittent status be approved by the Division, the site will be required to operate at least yearly but would be allowed to operate for less than 180 consecutive day per year. Excavation of mining materials or sale of stockpiled material must occur via activity which does not fall under 'Indications of Temporary Cessation' as defined in Rule 1.13.2. If the Operator wishes to pursue Intermittent Status, rather than apply for a second consecutive period of Temporary Cessation, please notify the Division at your earliest convenience of your intent to take the site out of its Temporary Cessation status and to apply for Intermittent status. Please ensure that an appropriate Intermittent Status revision form is completed and filed with the Division. A copy of this form has been included with this letter.
