RE: Collett Property, File No. M-2024-011, Receipt of Incomplete Construction Material Special (111) Operation Reclamation Permit Application Package

Dear Mr. Thompson:

On Monday, April 08, 2024, the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) received the Construction Material Special (111) Operation Reclamation Permit Application package for the Collett Property, File No. M-2024-012. A preliminary review of the information received determined that the following items must be received before the Division can consider the application submitted and technical review can begin:

1. Application form does not specify the post-mine land use. Please update the form and resubmit.
2. No Affidavit of Posting Notice (sign) was included as required by Rule 1.6.2(1)(b)

Additionally to expedite the review process the Division has conducted a preliminary adequacy review of the application materials submitted. The Division determined that the following issue(s) of concern shall be adequately addressed before the application can be considered for approval.

3. Pursuant to Rule 6.3.3(b) the estimated depth to which soil, suitable as a plant growth medium, will be salvaged for use in the reclamation process.
4. Specify if explosives will be used in conjunction with the mining or reclamation process pursuant to Rule 6.3.3(p)
5. The Division was under the impression that the new access road is not permitted to stay post mining. Please provide documentation from CDOT that a driveway permit will be granted, otherwise the road will need to be removed. Rule 6.3.4(1)(d)
6. Rule 6.3.7 Source of Legal Right-to-Enter. Agreement included but was not notarized.



7. A financial warranty in the amount of \$72,551. The replacement bond previously submitted was for Permit No. M-2022-051.
8. Provide a properly executed performance warranty

YOUR APPLICATION WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED SUBMITTED UNTIL ALL THE INFORMATION LISTED ABOVE IS RECEIVED AND FOUND SUFFICIENT TO BEGIN OUR REVIEW. A DECISION DATE WILL BE ESTABLISHED 15 DAYS FROM THE DATE OF RECEIPT OF ALL OF THE REQUESTED INFORMATION.

You have sixty (60) days from the above date to submit all necessary documents that the Office needs for an application to be considered filed. If, at the end of the sixty day period, the application has not been determined to be filed with the Office, the Office shall deny the application and terminate the application file.

This letter shall not be construed to mean that there are no other technical deficiencies in your application. The Division will review your application to determine whether it is adequate to meet the requirements of the Act after submittal of all required items.
