OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Prince Albert Mine is located approximately 2.5 miles west of Uravan and accessed from U16 Road. The site is a 110d operation that includes a total of 8.3 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$23,262.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is sufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by posts that were adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

The site was in temporary cessation beginning October 7, 2013. On November 11, 2018 the operator notified the Division that mining operations were resuming. On August 13, 2019 the Division inspected the site and found that no mining activity had resumed. On October 21, 2019 the operator notified the Division that final reclamation was commencing. And then, on August 31, 2023 the operator notified the Division that mining would recommence in November 2023.

Operations appear to have resumed at the site. A skid steer was on site and work has occurred in the pond area and around the dump and portal. A ventilation system is in now installed at the portal. The portal was secured with a locked gate.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
