The Division has received and reviewed the 2024 July monthly, and the 2024 Q2 Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs), including the acute and chronic WET testing results for the Trapper Mine. The DMRs were received electronically by the Division on 30 July 2024. Thank you for your timely submittal of this information. Trapper submits DMRs to the Division, in accordance with Rule 4.05.13(2)(a)(iii).

Trapper reported the following outfalls discharged in June and over the quarter:

- Johnson System Pond #10, NPDS 001
- No Name Pond #5 NPDES 002
- East Pyeatt #2
- East Middle Flume #021

Trapper reported that none of the outfalls requiring WET testing discharged. Monthly and quarterly DMRs for discharging outfalls indicated that no parameters were exceeded. The Division notes that the Johnson System pH is near the upper limit at 8.9
